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| 2  | AN ACT TO AMEND THE EMERGENCY PENSION FUND FOR LAW   |
| 3  | ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN MECKLENBURG COUNTY.  |
| 4  | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:   |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Chapter 709 of the 1965 Session Laws and Chapter 305 of the                       |
| 6  | 1967 Session Laws are repealed.  |
| 7  | SECTION 2. Chapter 446 of the Public-Local Laws of 1931 reads as                             |
| 8  | rewritten:   |
| 9  | "Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "The Emergency and                   |
| 10 | Pension Fund for Sworn Law Enforcement Officers of Mecklenburg County", and                  |
| 11 | County." This act shall apply to all law enforcement officers except as otherwise            |
| 12 | provided herein sworn law enforcement officers employed by any city, county, or town         |
| 13 | law enforcement agency in Mecklenburg County engaged in the enforcement of the               |
| 14 | criminal laws of the State of North Carolina within the County of Mecklenburg.               |
| 15 | Mecklenburg who are killed or permanently injured while in the discharge of their            |
| 16 | official duties.   |
| 17 | Sec. 2. "Law enforcement officers" shall be deemed to include all State-certified            |
| 18 | sworn peace officers employed in any city, county, or town law enforcement agency in         |
| 19 | Mecklenburg County who are required by the terms of their employment to give their           |
| 20 | full time to the enforcement of laws, the preservation of perfect order, the protection of   |
| 21 | life and property property, and the detection and prevention of crime and such special or    |
| 22 | part-time peace officers as may be killed or permanently injured while in the actual         |
| 23 | discharge of official duties as such officers: Provided, such officers, in order to share in |
| 24 | the benefits provided for in this act, shall register with the Officers Relief board         |
| 25 | provided for on blanks to be furnished for that purpose and in a manner to be prescribed     |
| 26 | by said board giving such information as to the duty of employment, etc., that may be        |
| 27 | prescribed by said board.crime. "Law enforcement officers" shall also be deemed to           |
| 28 | include any reserve officer of an agency of Mecklenburg County and any detention             |
| 29 | officer employed by the Sheriff of Mecklenburg County.                                       |

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Sec. 3. That the Mayor of the City of Charlotte, the Chief of Police of the City of 1 Charlotte, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department, the Chairman of the Mecklenburg 2 3 County Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Mecklenburg County, the Chief of 4 Rural Police or their designees, and their successors in office be and they are hereby 5 constituted members ex officio of a board to be known as "The Officers Relief Board of 6 Mecklenburg County","The Emergency Pension Fund for Sworn Law Enforcement Officers of Mecklenburg County", to administer the provisions of this act and said 7 8 board shall elect its own chairman and appoint an officer of the Board to be known as 9 "Commissioner of the Emergency Pension Fund for Sworn Law Enforcement Officers of the County of Mecklenburg", Mecklenburg County", who shall also act as Secretary 10 and Treasurer of the Board and shall act under the instructions of the Board in all 11 12 matters pertaining to the administration of this act. And the Board shall require the 13 Secretary and Treasurer to give good and sufficient bond, the amount to be determined 14 in the discretion of the Board, for the proper performance of his duties as such. The 15 premium of said bond shall be paid out of the fund herein provided for. Each ex officio 16 member of the board may appoint an employee of the member's agency to act as the 17 member's designee. The designee shall have the authority to cast a binding vote on 18 behalf of the ex officio member. Sec. 4. That in order to provide funds for "The Emergency Pension Fund of the 19

20 County of Mecklenburg" herein set out, there shall be taxed in the bill of costs in all 21 criminal cases in any Court other than that of Justice of Peace wherein there is a conviction or a plea of guilty, a fee of one (\$1.00) dollar to be known as "The 22 Emergency and Pension Fee" and the same shall be collected by the Clerk of the City 23 24 Recorder's Court, the Clerk of the County Recorder's Court and the Clerk of the Superior Court and shall be paid to the Treasurer of the "Officers Relief Board of 25 Mecklenburg County" or in cases of appeal from said City Recorder's Court or County 26 27 Recorder's Court to the Superior Court, the Clerk of the Superior Court shall collect said fees and pay the same to the Treasurer of the "Officers Relief Board of Mecklenburg 28 29 County." All money collected by the Clerk of the City Recorder's Court, Clerk of the 30 County Recorder's Court shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the "Officers Relief Board of Mecklenburg County" once each week and all of said money collected by the 31 32 Clerk of the Superior Court shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the "Officers Relief Board of Mecklenburg County" on the first day of each and every month and they shall 33 accompany such remittance with a detailed and itemized statement of the cases in which 34 35 said funds have been collected, the blank forms for said statement shall be furnished by the "Officers Relief Board of Mecklenburg County" herein provided for. In all cases 36 where the defendant is committed to the roads, the fee herein provided shall not be 37 38 charged against said defendant where said defendant serves the sentence imposed by the 39 Court and it is further provided that the one dollar (\$1.00) fee hereinbefore set out shall not be collected in cases of conviction or plea of guilty for the violation of the traffic or 40 highway laws by use of a motor vehicle where the punishment provided by the Statute 41 42 is not in excess of fifty dollars (\$50.00) fine or thirty days (30) imprisonment; the said fee shall be collected in all other cases for violation of said laws where the punishment 43 fixed by the Statute is in excess of the penalties herein before mentioned; Provided 44

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further, that where the defendant is convicted on more than one charge, the fee
hereinbefore provided for shall only be taxed in the cost in one conviction.

3 Sec. 5. The funds accumulated under this act shall be known as the "Emergency and 4 "The Emergency Pension Fund of the County of Mecklenburg", for Sworn Law Enforcement Officers of Mecklenburg County", and shall be used as a fund for all 5 6 arresting law enforcement officers, as defined in section two hereof, and their families, 7 under the following terms and conditions, that is to say: If an officer while in the actual 8 performance of his duties shall become disabled, there shall be paid to him a sum not in 9 excess of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). and a monthly pension while so disabled not 10 in excess of seventy five dollars (\$75.00) per month, and the board may pay to such disabled officer an additional sum not in excess of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per month 11 12 for each child or dependent under the age of eighteen years while the disability of such 13 officers may exist and while the said officer shall live; and in case of death resulting 14 while in the actual performance of his duties, if the officer shall be married, the board 15 may pay immediately to the widow of such officer a sum not in excess of five hundred 16 dollars (\$500.00), and may further pay a sum not in excess of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per 17 month for said widow during widowhood, and, in addition thereto, the board may pay 18 the said widow for the support of any dependent children she may have, a sum not in 19 excess of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per month for each child until said child shall reach the age of eighteen (18) years; and in case of death resulting while in the actual 20 21 performance of official duties under this act where the individual or officer as herein 22 defined may be unmarried, the board may pay to the nearest dependent next of kin of deceased a sum not in excess of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, or in lieu thereof the 23 24 board may pay the funeral expenses of deceased not in excess of five hundred (\$500.00) 25 dollars; and it is further the true intent, meaning and purpose of this act that the board shall be empowered hereunder, in its discretion, to pay any amount less than the 26 27 maximum enumerated, and said board may refuse to make a payment of any amount in 28 any case in any or all of the classes herein enumerated.conditions:

| 32 |            | surviving spouse of the deceased officer. If the law enforcement         |
| 33 |            | officer is not married at the time of death, the board may pay the death |
| 34 |            | benefit to the nearest dependent next of kin of the deceased; or         |
| 35 | (2)        | If the law enforcement officer is permanently and totally physically     |
| 36 |            | disabled due to a physical injury received in the actual performance of  |
| 37 |            | the officer's duties, then the Board may pay from the Fund to the law    |
| 38 |            | enforcement officer the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000). In    |
| 39 |            | the event the law enforcement officer is temporarily and totally         |
| 40 |            | physically disabled due to a physical injury received in the             |
| 41 |            | performance of the officer's duties, then the Board may pay from the     |
| 42 |            | Fund to the law enforcement officer a disability supplement of five      |
| 43 |            | hundred dollars (\$500.00) a month during the time that the officer is   |
| 44 |            | temporarily and totally disabled up to a maximum of ten thousand         |

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| 1        | dollars (\$10,000). In any event, a temporarily or permanently   |
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| 2        | physically disabled law enforcement officer shall not receive more   |
| 3        | than that ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).   |
| 4        | (3) If a law enforcement officer is killed while in the actual performance   |
| 5        | of the officer's duties or is permanently and totally disabled, then the   |
| 6        | Board may award college scholarships to the officer's children up to a   |
| 7        | maximum amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000). Such  |
| 8        | scholarships may be awarded if the child is between the ages of 17 and   |
| 9        | 22 and has been accepted or is attending a fully accredited college or   |
| 10       | <u>university.</u>   |
| 11       | Sec. 6. The Board created under the provisions of this act shall serve without   |
| 12       | compensation. The Secretary and Treasurer of said Board shall receive such   |
| 13       | compensation as may be provided by the Board not to exceed the sum of fifty (\$50.00)  |
| 14       | dollars per month, and the said Board shall have full power and authority to pay all   |
| 15       | expenses for administering this act including the purchase of supplies, legal advice, etc.,  |
| 16       | out of the fund provided for herein. The Board shall have authority to make such rules,  |
| 17       | regulations and provisions as may be necessary to the proper administration of this act.   |
| 18       | The Board may retain an investment firm to manage the Fund and upon a unanimous  |
| 19       | vote of the Board may increase the amount of the maximum lump sum payments by up   |
| 20       | to ten percent (10%) once every five years.  |
| 21       | Sec. 7. Any person or officer of Court covered by the provisions of this act who   |
| 22       | shall fail to comply with the provisions of this act and make proper accounting and  |
| 23       | remittance to the Treasurer designated by the Board, or to the Secretary, funds collected  |
| 24       | under and by virtue of this act, as provided herein, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor,   |
| 25<br>26 | and, upon conviction, shall be fined or imprisoned, in the discretion of the Court.  |
| 26<br>27 | Sec. 8. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed, and if any section hereof be decided by the Courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same |
| 27       | shall not affect the validity of this act as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part  |
| 28<br>29 | decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.   |
| 29<br>30 | Sec. 9. This act shall be in force and effect from and after the first day of June, one  |
| 31       | thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, but disbursement of funds in accordance with the   |
| 32       | act, except for necessary expenses of administration, and organization, shall not  |
| 33       | commence until the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one."   |
| 34       | SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.  |
