March 31, 2003 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT HEALTH EDUCATION COURSES OFFERED IN 3 PUBLIC SCHOOLS PROVIDE MEDICALLY AND FACTUALLY ACCURATE 4 INFORMATION. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Article 8 of Chapter 115C is amended by adding the following 6 7 new Part to read: 8 "Part 3B. School Health Education Program. 9 "§ 115C-102.10. Health education courses. 10 (a) All health education courses, including abstinence until marriage education, 11 paid for in whole or in part with public funds for use in public schools or elsewhere, 12 shall provide medically and factually accurate information. All material and instruction in classes where health education is taught shall be age appropriate. 13 14 (b) In addition to medically and factually accurate information, the State Board of Education shall present information that abstinence from sexual intercourse is the 15 16 most effective means to prevent unwanted teenage pregnancy, sexually transmitted 17 diseases, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) when transmitted sexually. The State Board of Education shall provide students with statistics based on the latest 18 medical information that cite failure and success rates of condoms and other 19 20 contraceptives in preventing pregnancy, AIDS, and other sexually transmitted diseases. As used in this section, 'medically and factually accurate' means verified or 21 (c) supported by research conducted in compliance with scientific methods and published 22 23 in peer-review journals, where appropriate, and recognized as accurate and objective by professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, including 24 25 the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, or the Centers for Disease Control and 26 Prevention." 27 28 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to school

29 years beginning 2004-2005.
