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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENABLE RETIRED EDUCATORS TO RETURN TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHOUT LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Short Title: Retired Educators Return to Work.

SECTION 1. G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten:

5 Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service 6 "c. retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, or 7 otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employer 8 participating in the Retirement System on a part-time, 9 temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, whether 10 contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an 11 amount during the 12-month period immediately following the 12 effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which 13 exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation, 14 excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service 15 preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand 16 dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed, 17 then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first 18 day of the month following the month in which the 19 reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the 20 balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the 21 beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year 22 following suspension. The amount that may be earned before 23 suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the 24 ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier, 25 calculated to the nearest tenth of a percent (1/10 of 1%). 26

The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary 1 2 under this sub-subdivision, G.S. 135-3(8)c., who has been 3 retired at least six two months and has not been employed in any capacity, except as a substitute teacher or a part-time tutor, 4 5 teacher or other substitute employee, with a public school for at 6 least six two months immediately preceding the effective date 7 of reemployment, shall not include earnings while the 8 beneficiary is employed to teach on a substitute, interim, or 9 permanent basis in a public school. The Department of Public 10 Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed to teach by a local school 11 12 administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher educator as the term is defined under the 13 14 provisions of G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a). 15 Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter 16 17 as a result of this period of employment." 18 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) reads as rewritten: "Retired teacher" educator" means a beneficiary of the Teachers' and 19 20 State Employees' Retirement System of North Carolina who who: 21 Was previously employed as a (i) teacher, (ii) principal, or (iii) <u>a.</u> assistant principal, 22 has Has been retired at least six two months. 23 <u>b.</u> has Has not been employed in any capacity, other than as a 24 c. 25 substitute teacher or a part-time tutor, teacher or other substitute employee, with a local board of education for at least sixtwo 26 27 months. immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, 28 29 is Is determined by a local board of education to have had d. 30 satisfactory performance during the last year of employment by a local board of education, and 31 32 who is Is employed to teach as provided in G.S. 135-3(8)c. A <u>e.</u> 33 retired teacher educator who is a teacher as defined in subdivision (6) of this subsection shall be treated the same as a 34 35 probationary teacher except that (i) a retired teacher educator is not eligible for career status and (ii) the performance of a retired 36 teacher educator who had attained career status prior to 37

SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-316(d) reads as rewritten:

A local board of education may pay a retired teacher, educator, as that term is defined in G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) no more than the employee would have received on the teacher appropriate salary schedule, excluding longevity, had the employee not retired."

Effective January 1, 1999, through June 30, 2004, G.S. 135-3(8)c., 7 8 as rewritten by Section 28.24(a) of S.L. 1998-212 reads as rewritten:" 9 **SECTION 6.** Subsection (b) of Section 67.1 of S.L. 1998-217, as rewritten 10 by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126, reads as rewritten: "(b) This section becomes effective January 1, 1999, and expires June 30, 2004. 11 12 <u>1999.</u>" SECTION 7. Subsection (c) of Section 32.25 of S.L. 2001-424, as rewritten 13 14 by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126, reads as rewritten: 15 "SECTION 32.25.(c) This section becomes effective July 1, 2001, and expires June 16 30, 2004. 2001." 17 **SECTION 8.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
