SCHOOI The General	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED D ENABLE RETIRED EDUCATORS TO RETURN TO THE PUBLICS SWITHOUT LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS. Assembly of North Carolina enacts: CCTION 1. G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten: "c. Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employ participating in the Retirement System on a part-time temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, wheth contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns a amount during the 12-month period immediately following the effective date of retirement or in any calendar year whice exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousan dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexe then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the fin day of the month following the month in which the reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year following suspension. The amount that may be earned befor suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier	ce or er an he ch on, ce d d, the he ar he he he

1	The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary
2	under this sub-subdivision, G.S. 135-3(8)c., who has been
3	retired at least six two months and has not been employed in
