SENATE BILL 736

Short Title: Expand Scope of Hate Crimes. (Public) Senators Lucas; Dannelly, Dorsett, Holloman, Kinnaird, Malone, and Sponsors: Metcalf. Referred to: Judiciary I. April 3, 2003 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO HONOR THE MEMORY OF MATTHEW SHEPARD BY EXPANDING 3 THE SCOPE OF THE HATE CRIME LAWS AND INCREASING THE 4 CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR COMMITTING A HATE CRIME. Whereas, Matthew Shepard was seemingly a victim of a hate crime, his 5 6 sexual orientation being the apparent reason for his murder; and Whereas, Matthew Shepard was recently a resident of this State and lived in 7 Raleigh for about a year; and 8 9 Whereas, violent crime is abhorrent, and violent criminal acts based on a 10 person's group membership are particularly unacceptable in a civil society; Now, 11 therefore, 12 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 13 SECTION 1. G.S. 14-3 reads as rewritten: "§ 14-3. Punishment of misdemeanors, infamous offenses, offenses committed in 14 secrecy and malice, or with deceit and intent to defraud, or with ethnic 15 16 animosity.animosity based upon ethnicity, gender or gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or disability; punishment of felony committed 17 with animosity based upon ethnicity, gender or gender expression, age, 18 sexual orientation, or disability. 19 Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c), every person who shall be 20 (a) convicted of any misdemeanor for which no specific classification and no specific 21 22 punishment is prescribed by statute shall be punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor. Any misdemeanor that has a specific punishment, but is not assigned a classification by the 23 General Assembly pursuant to law is classified as follows, based on the maximum 24 25 punishment allowed by law for the offense as it existed on the effective date of Article 81B of Chapter 15A of the General Statutes: 26

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(1) If that maximum punishment is more than six months imprisonment, it is a Class 1 misdemeanor;

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| 2 | six months imprisonment, it is a Class 2 misdemeanor; and |
| 3 | (3) If that maximum punishment is 30 days or less imprisonment or only a |
| 4 | fine, it is a Class 3 misdemeanor. |
| 5 | Misdemeanors that have punishments for one or more counties or cities pursuant to a |
| 6 | local act of the General Assembly that are different from the generally applicable |
| 7 | punishment are classified pursuant to this subsection if not otherwise specifically |
| 8 | classified. |
| 9 | (b) If a misdemeanor offense as to which no specific punishment is prescribed be |
| 10 | infamous, done in secrecy and malice, or with deceit and intent to defraud, the offender |
| 11 | shall, except where the offense is a conspiracy to commit a misdemeanor, be guilty of a |
| 12 | Class H felony. |
| 13 | (c) If any Class 2 or Class 3 misdemeanor is committed because of the victim's |
| 14 | real or perceived race, color, religion, nationality, gender or gender expression, sexual |
| 15 | orientation, disability, age, or country of origin, the offender shall be guilty of a Class 1 |
| 16 | misdemeanor. If any Class A1 or Class 1 misdemeanor offense is committed because of |
| 17 | the victim's real or perceived race, color, religion, nationality, gender or gender |
| 18 | expression, sexual orientation, disability, age, or country of origin, the offender shall be |
| 19 | guilty of a Class I felony. |
| 20 | (d) If any felony is committed because of the victim's real or perceived race, |
| 21 | color, religion, nationality, gender or gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, |
| 22 | age, or country of origin, the offender shall be punished at the sentencing level that is |
| 23 | one level higher than that authorized by the offender's prior record level." |
| 24 | SECTION 2. G.S. 14-401.14(a) reads as rewritten: |
| 25 | "(a) If a person shall, because of <u>real or perceived</u> race, color, religion, nationality, |
| 26 | gender or gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, age, or country of origin, |
| 27 | assault another person, or damage or deface the property of another person, or threaten |
| 28 | to do any such act, he the offender shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor." |
| 29 | SECTION 3. G.S. 15A-1340.16(d)(17) reads as rewritten: |
| 30 | "(17) The offense for which the defendant stands convicted was committed |
| 31 | against a victim because of the victim's real or perceived race, color, |
| 32 | religion, nationality, gender or gender expression, sexual orientation, |
| 33 | disability, age, or country of origin." |
| 34 | SECTION 4. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to |
| 35 | offenses committed on or after that date. |
