5	SECTION 1 Article 3 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended

9	"§ 143B-216.70. Legislative findings and purpose.		
10	(a) The General Assembly makes the following findings:		
11	(1) Maintaining the general health, welfare, and prosperity of the people		
12	of this State requires that all citizens receive essential levels of heat		
13	and electric service regardless of their economic circumstance.		
14	(2) Declining federal low-income energy assistance funding necessitates a		
15	State response to ensure the continuity and further development of		
16	energy assistance and related policies and programs in the State.		
17	(3) Current energy assistance policies and programs in the State have		
18	benefited North Carolina citizens, and should be continued with the		
19	modifications provided in this Part.		
20	(b) The General Assembly declares that it is the policy of this State that a		
21	weatherization assistance program should be utilized to: (i) increase the energy		
22	efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by low-income persons, particularly the most		
23	vulnerable of this group, the elderly, persons with disabilities, families with children,		
24	high residential energy users, and households with a high-energy burdens; (ii) reduce		
25	low-income persons' total residential expenditures; and improve low-income persons'		
26	health and safety. The State shall utilize all appropriate and available means to fund the
