April 3, 2003 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS TO COVER MEDICALLY 3 NECESSARY EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN FROM 4 BIRTH TO THREE YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE COVERED UNDER THE 5 PLAN. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7 **SECTION 1.** Article 51 of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes is amended by 8 adding the following new section to read: 9 "§ 58-51-36. Coverage for early intervention services to children from birth to 10 three years of age. 11 Definitions. - As used in this section, unless the context clearly requires (a) 12 otherwise, the term: 13 'Early intervention services' means those services provided for infants (1)and toddlers required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education 14 15 Act (IDEA), P.L. 105-17, as codified in 20 U.S.C.§ 1400, et seq., and 16 applied and implemented in accordance with rules adopted by the Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Health and Human 17 Services. 18 19 'Health benefit plan' has the meaning applied under G.S. 58-3-167. (2)'Individualized Family Service Plan' is the Plan required by the 20 (3) Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), P.L. 105-17, as 21 22 codified in 20 U.S.C.§ 1400, et seq., and applied and implemented in accordance with rules adopted by the Secretary of the North Carolina 23 Department of Health and Human Services. 24 'Insurer' has the meaning applied under G.S. 58-3-167. 25 (4) Notwithstanding G.S. 58-50-63, every health benefit plan issued by an 26 (b) insurer, and every preferred provider benefit plan under G.S. 58-50-56 that provides 27 benefits for any sickness, illness, or disability of any minor child or that provides 28

1		y medical treatment or service furnished by a health care provider or							
2	institution to any minor child shall provide coverage for medically necessary early								
3	intervention services for children ages birth to 36 months who are eligible for these								
4	services and who are otherwise covered under the health benefit plan. A child is eligible								
5	for early intervention services if the child is between the ages of birth to 36 months and								
6	meets the eligibility requirements established in rules adopted by the Secretary of the								
7		Department of Health and Human Services. Coverage for early							
8	intervention services shall be as follows:								
9	<u>(1)</u>	Services that are not otherwise covered by the health benefit plan and							
10		are part of the child's Individualized Family Services Plan. Benefits							
11		payable for the services provided under this subdivision may be							
12		limited to not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) annually and							
13		not more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) over the three-year							
14		eligibility period, per child covered. These limits shall be in addition to							
15		any annual or lifetime limits applicable under the health benefit plan.							
16	<u>(2)</u>	Covered services shall be provided by a certified early intervention							
17		specialist in accordance with rules adopted by the Secretary of the							
18		North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.							
19	<u>(4)</u>	Coverage is required under this section only for those early							
20		intervention services not covered by Medicaid or other public							
21		assistance program for which the child is eligible."

39		equal to the coverage required by G.S. 58-3-178, if the plan covers							
40		prescription drugs or devices, or outpatient services, as applicable. The							
41		same exceptions and exclusions as are provided under G.S. 58-3-178							
42		apply to standard plans developed and approved under G.S. 58-50-125.							
43	(6)	Colorectal cancer examinations and laboratory tests at least equal to							
44		the coverage required by G.S. 58-3-179.
