There is hereby created the Council for the Deaf and the Hard of Hearing of the		
1 Department of Health and Human Services. The Council shall have duties including the		
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(1)	To make recommendations to the Secretary of the Department of	
	Health and Human Services regarding improvement of human services	
	to the deaf and the hard of hearing; for cost-effective provision,	
	coordination, and improvement of services;	
(2)	To study ways to promote public understanding of the problems of the	
	deaf and the hard of hearing and to consider the need for new State	
	programs concerning deafness; create public awareness of the specific	
	needs and abilities of people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deaf-	
	blind and to consider the need for new State programs concerning the

After the initial appointees' 8 terms have expired, all members shall be appointed for a term of four years. No member 9 appointed by the Governor shall serve more than two successive terms.terms unless the 10 member is an employee of the Department of Health and Human Services or the Department of Public Instruction representing his or her agency as a specialist in the 11 12 field of service. 13 Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Council created by the resignation, 14 dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired 15 term. 16 (c) The chairman of the Council shall be designated by the Secretary of the 17 Department of Health and Human Services from the Council members. The chairman 18 shall hold this office for not more than four years. 19 (d) The Council shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the 20 chairman. A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum. 21 (e) Council members shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the 22 performance of their duties in accordance with G.S. 138-5. The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services shall provide 23 (f) 24 clerical and other assistance as needed." 25 **SECTION 3.** Pursuant to G.S. 143B-216.32(a), as enacted in Section 2 of this act, when the term of the member appointed by the Secretary of Health and Human 26 27 Services who is a representative from Statewide Parents' Education and Advocacy for 28 Kids (SPEAK) expires, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall appoint one 29 member upon the recommendation of the North Carolina Black Deaf Advocates to serve 30 a four-year term to commence when this act becomes effective. Pursuant to G.S. 143B-216.32(a), as enacted in Section 2 of this act, the 31 32 member appointed by the Governor as recommended by the President of the North 33 Carolina Deaf-Blind Associates shall be appointed for a four-year term to commence 34 when this act becomes effective and the member appointed by the Governor as 35 recommended by a local education agency shall be appointed for a four-year term to commence when this act becomes effective. Members described in this section shall 36 37 serve for the terms for which they were appointed and until their successors are 38 appointed and qualified. 39 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
