The Department of Public Instruction and the Office of State 4 Personnel, in consultation with the Retirement Systems Division, shall study the impact of eliminating the postretirement earnings restriction for teachers and shall also evaluate 5 6 the potential for eliminating that restriction for all State employees. The study shall 7 provide separate evaluations for eliminating the restriction for all State employees, alternatively applying both a two-month waiting period and a six-month waiting period 8 9 prior to reemployment. The Department of Public Instruction and the Office of State 10 Personnel shall report their findings and any recommendations to the 2007 General Assembly. 11 12 **SECTION 6.** This act becomes effective June 30, 2005.
