9	(e1) Assignment of Teachers With NBPTS Certification to Serve as School
10	Leaders The maximum number of teachers with NBPTS certification that a local
11	board of education may assign to serve as school leaders is the greater of (i) five or (ii
12	five percent (5%) of the number of teachers it has during the 2004-2005 school year
13	with NBPTS certification. A teacher may serve as a school leader for up to three years.
14	A teacher must teach in a classroom for at least two years after receiving NBPTS
15	certification to be eligible for assignment as a school leader.
16	A teacher serving as a school leader shall be school-based, work at one or more
17	schools, and work only at the school level. The teacher shall (i) provide direct support in
18	areas such as professional development, demonstration lessons, support for candidate
19	for NBPTS certification, mentoring, and curriculum development, and (ii) perform other
20	school-based duties as determined by the principal or principals, after consultation with
21	the teacher."
22	SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall monitor and assess the
23	effectiveness and impact of letting teachers with NBPTS certification serve as school
24	leaders and shall report its findings to the Joint Legislative Education Oversigh
25	Committee prior to April 15, 2008.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.

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
