6	(e1) Assignment of Teachers With NBPTS Certification to Serve as School
7	Leaders. – Each school year a local board of education may assign to serve as school
8	leaders the greater of (i) five teachers with NBPTS certification or (ii) five percent (5%)
9	of the number of teachers with NBPTS certification in the local school administrative
10	unit in the 2004-2005 school year. A teacher may serve as a school leader for up to three
11	years.
12	A teacher must teach in a classroom for at least two years after receiving NBPTS
13	certification to be eligible for assignment as a school leader. A teacher shall not be
14	required to serve as a school leader.
15	A teacher serving as a school leader shall be school-based, work at one or more
16	schools, and work only at the school level. The teacher shall (i) provide direct support in
17	areas such as professional development, demonstration lessons, support for candidates
18	for NBPTS certification, mentoring, and curriculum development, and (ii) perform other
19	school-based, nonadministrative duties as determined by the principal or principals.
20	after consultation with the teacher."
21	SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall monitor and assess the
22	effectiveness and impact of letting teachers with NBPTS certification serve as school
23	leaders and shall report its findings to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight
24	Committee prior to April 15, 2008.
25	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
