2	AN ACT TO	AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO

4	BEVERAGE CONTROL STORES AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS.				
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
6	SEC	<b>FION 1.</b> The Legislative Research Commission may study issues			
7	related to the privatization of alcoholic beverage control stores and related matters of				
8	regulation of alcoholic beverage sales in this State. If this study is undertaken, the				
9	Commission shall examine the following issues:				
10	(1)	The forms of regulation of alcoholic beverages sales in control states			
11		(Alabama; Idaho; Iowa; Maine; Montgomery County, Maryland;			
12		Michigan; Mississippi; Montana; New Hampshire; Ohio; Oregon;			
13		Pennsylvania; Utah; Vermont; Virginia; Washington; West Virginia;			
14		and Wyoming) in addition to North Carolina and the forms of			
15		regulation of alcoholic beverage sales in the remaining states.			
16	(2)	The feasibility of partial privatization (where the State privatizes the			
17		retail function but retains the wholesale function of liquor distribution)			
18		and full privatization (where the State privatizes both the retail and			
19		wholesale functions of liquor distribution).			
20	(3)	The effects that either partial privatization or full privatization would			
21		have on the following:			
22		a. Price.			
23		b. Revenues.			
24		c. Taxes.			
25		d. Employment.			
26		e. Facilities.			
27		f. Sales and consumption.			
28		g. Service.

11	The Commission may report to the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General			
12	Assembly or to the 2007 General Assembly on its findings and may make any			
13	legislative recommendations it considers appropriate.			
14	<b>SECTION 2.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General			
15	Assembly the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal			
16	year to implement this act.			
17	<b>SECTION 3.</b>	This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
