2	AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE NORTH CAROLINA MEDICAL BOARD T				
3	LICENSE AND REGULATE ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS.				
4	Whereas, there is a documented shortage of anesthesia providers in North				
5	Carolina; and				
6	Whereas, anesthesiologist assistants are licensed by many states to provide				
7	anesthesia services under the supervision of an anesthesiologist; and				
8	Whereas, licensure of anesthesiologist assistants in North Carolina woul				
9	help alleviate the existing shortage of anesthesia providers in this State; and				
10	Whereas, anesthesiologist assistants have excellent clinical safety records, are				
11	highly trained, and are authorized to provide anesthesia services under such federal				
12	programs as Medicare, Medicaid, TriCare, and the Veterans Administration; Now,				
13	therefore,				
14	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
15	SECTION 1. G.S. 90-11 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:				
16	"(a1) Each applicant for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant in the State shal				
17	satisfy the North Carolina Medical Board that the applicant is of good moral characte				
18	and meets the other qualifications for the issuance of a license before a license is				
19	granted by the Board to the applicant."				
20	SECTION 2. G.S. 90-15 reads as rewritten:				
21	"§ 90-15. License fee; salaries, fees, and expenses of Board.				

Each applicant for a license by examination shall pay to the North Carolina Medical Board a fee which shall be prescribed by the Board in an amount not exceeding the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) plus the cost of test materials before being admitted to the examination. Whenever a license is granted without examination, as authorized in G.S. 90-13, the applicant shall pay to the Board a fee in an amount to be prescribed by the Board not in excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Whenever a limited

license is granted as provided in G.S. 90-12, the applicant shall pay to the Board a fee 1 2 not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00), except where a limited license to 3 practice in a medical education and training program approved by the Board for the purpose of education or training is granted, the applicant shall pay a fee of twenty-five 4 5 dollars (\$25.00), and where a limited license to practice medicine and surgery only at 6 clinics that specialize in the treatment of indigent patients is granted, the applicant shall not pay a fee. A fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid for the issuance of a 7 8 duplicate license. All fees shall be paid in advance to the North Carolina Medical Board, 9 to be held in a fund for the use of the Board. The compensation and expenses of the 10 members and officers of the Board and all expenses proper and necessary in the opinion of the Board to the discharge of its duties under and to enforce the laws regulating the 11 12 practice of medicine or surgery shall be paid out of the fund, upon the warrant of the Board. The per diem compensation of Board members shall not exceed two hundred 13 14 dollars (\$200.00) per day per member for time spent in the performance and discharge 15 of duties as a member. Any unexpended sum or sums of money remaining in the treasury of the Board at the expiration of the terms of office of the members of the 16 17 Board shall be paid over to their successors in office. 18 For the initial and annual registration of an assistant to a physician, the Board may require the payment of a fee not to exceed a reasonable amount. 19 20 For the initial and annual registration of an anesthesiologist assistant, the Board may 21 require the payment of a fee not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00)." **SECTION 3.** G.S. 90-18(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 22 23 The following shall not constitute practicing medicine or surgery as defined ''(c)24 in subsection (b) of this section: 25 The provision of anesthesia services by a licensed anesthesiologist 26 (20)assistant under the supervision of an anesthesiologist licensed under 27 Article 1 of this Chapter." 28 **SECTION 4.** Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by 29 30 adding a new section to read: 31 "§ 90-18.5. Limitations on anesthesiologist assistants. Any person who is licensed under the provisions of G.S. 90-11 to perform 32 (a) medical acts, tasks, and functions as an assistant to an anesthesiologist licensed under 33 Article 1 of this Chapter may use the title 'anesthesiologist assistant'. Any other person 34 35 who uses the title in any form or holds himself or herself out to be an anesthesiologist assistant or to be so licensed shall be deemed to be in violation of this Article. A student 36 in any anesthesiologist assistant training program shall be identified as a 'student 37 38 anesthesiologist assistant' or an 'anesthesiologist assistant student', but under no circumstances shall the student use or permit to be used on the student's behalf, the 39 terms 'intern', 'resident', or 'fellow'. 40 Anesthesiologist assistants are authorized to provide anesthesia services 41 (b) 42 under the supervision of an anesthesiologist licensed under Article 1 of this Chapter, including the development and implementation of an anesthesia care plan for a patient, 43 under the following conditions: 44
