5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-51 reads as rewritten:
7	'§ 20-51. Exempt from registration.
8	The following shall be exempt from the requirement of registration and certificate of
9	itle:
10	
11	(16) Any all-terrain vehicle operated by a public safety agency, to include
12	but not be limited to municipal police departments, municipal and
13	volunteer fire departments, municipal or contracted ocean rescue
14	organizations or rescue squads, that is used in the furtherance of its
15	duties."
16	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-183.2(a1) reads as rewritten:
17	"(a1) Safety Inspection Exception. <u>Exceptions.</u> – <u>The following vehicles are</u>
18	exempt from safety inspections:
19	(1) Historic vehicles, as defined in G.S. 20-79.4(b)(17), shall not be
20	subject to a safety inspection pursuant to this Article.G.S.
21	<u>20-79.4(b)(17).</u>
22	(2) Any all-terrain vehicle operated by a public safety agency, to include
23	but not be limited to municipal police departments, municipal and
24	volunteer fire departments, municipal or contracted ocean rescue
25	organizations or rescue squads, that is used in the furtherance of its
26	duties."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a
2	new section to read:
3	" <u>§ 20-137.3. Public safety all-terrain vehicles exempt from equipment</u>
4	<u>requirements.</u>
5	Any all-terrain vehicle operated by a public safety agency, to include but not be
6	limited to municipal police departments, municipal and volunteer fire departments,
7	municipal or contracted ocean rescue organizations or rescue squads, that is used in the
8	furtherance of its duties shall be exempt from the equipment requirements of Part 9 of
9	this Article."
10	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
