A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE GENERAL STATUTES TO IMPLEMENT AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE THAT WHEN A DISTRICT COURT JUDGE IS COMPLETING A FOUR-YEAR ELECTIVE TERM OF OFFICE, AND WISHES TO CONTINUE IN OFFICE, THE NEXT ELECTION SHALL BE BY VOTE OF THE PEOPLE FOR RETENTION FOR AN EIGHT-YEAR TERM.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** This act provides the implementing legislation for a constitutional amendment that provides for retention elections for district court judges after their initial elective term.

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective only if the qualified voters approve the constitutional amendment proposed by AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE THAT WHEN A DISTRICT COURT JUDGE IS COMPLETING A FOUR-YEAR ELECTIVE TERM OF OFFICE, AND WISHES TO CONTINUE IN OFFICE, THE NEXT ELECTION SHALL BE BY VOTE OF THE PEOPLE FOR RETENTION FOR AN EIGHT-YEAR TERM.

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
