Wooden pallets." (11)21 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 130A-309.10 is amended by adding a new subsection to 22 23 read: 24 A county or city may petition the Department for a waiver from the "(k) 25
 - "(k) A county or city may petition the Department for a waiver from the prohibition on disposal of a material described in subdivisions (9), (10), and (11) of subsection (f) of this section in a landfill based on a showing that prohibiting the disposal of the material would constitute an economic hardship."

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective 1 October 2009.

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
