1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE RECOVERY OF ATTORNEYS' FEES AGAINST
3	CUSTODIANS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE TRANSFER PROVISIONS
4	OF THE NORTH CAROLINA UNIFORM TRANSFERS TO MINORS ACT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 33A-20 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 33A-20. Termination of custodianship.
8	(a) The custodian shall transfer in an appropriate manner the custodial property
9	to the minor or to the minor's estate upon the earlier of:
10	(1) The minor's attainment of 21 years of age with respect to custodial
11	property transferred under G.S. 33A-4 or G.S. 33A-5, except that any
12	transferor may have custodial property transferred to the minor at any
13	time after the age of 18 and before the age of 21 by a designation in
14	the following words or their equivalent: "The custodian shall transfer
15	this property to (name of minor) when he reaches the age of
16	(age after 18 and before 21).";
17	(2) The minor's attainment of age 18 with respect to custodial property
18	transferred under G.S. 33A-6 or G.S. 33A-7; or
19	(3) The minor's death.
20	(b) In the event that a custodian fails to comply with the provisions of subsection
21	(a) of this section, a person bringing a successful action to compel transfer under that
22	subsection is entitled to recover from the custodian all reasonable expenses incurred in
23	maintaining the action, including attorneys' fees."
24	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2005.
