4	and a determination that an activity is not unfair competition and therefore does not
5	violate this section shall be an absolute defense in any prosecution brought under this
6	section.
7	(k) The proceeds of any activity undertaken under subsection (i) or subsection (j)
8	of this section shall be placed in an institutional trust fund pursuant to G.S. 116-36.1 and
9	shall be used to continue to conduct the activity that generated the proceeds or to further
10	the mission of the constituent institution or other University entity engaging in the
11	activity."
12	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
