4		State's need for nursing faculty and within funds available, but in no		
5		event shall more than 100 nursing faculty fellows scholarship loans be		
6		made in each year.		
7	<u>(3)</u>	In order to attract faculty fellow graduates to a particular school of		
8		nursing, that school of nursing may use a portion of its funds for		
9		nursing faculty to cover one-half of the cost of the two-year		
10		scholarship loan program in exchange for a two-year commitment to		
11		the school from the nursing faculty fellow. To qualify for this option, a		
12		school of nursing must maintain an attrition rate of not more than		
13		twenty-five percent (25%) for the previous two years and meet all		
14		North Carolina Board of Nursing standards for program approval.		
15		Commission shall adopt stringent standards to ensure that only the best

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1	(b) The SEAA shall forgive the loan if, within four years after graduation from a		
2	nursing faculty education program, the recipient teaches in a North Carolina school of		
3	nursing for each year a scholarship loan was provided. If the recipient repays the		
4	scholarship loan by cash payments, all indebtedness shall be repaid within 10 years.		
5	(c) All funds appropriated to or otherwise received by the Program for		
6	scholarships, all funds received as repayment of scholarship loans, and all interest		
7	earned on these funds shall be placed in a revolving fund. The revolving fund may be		
8	used only for scholarship loans granted under the Program."		
9	SECTION 2.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State		
10	Education Assistance Authority the sum of three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars		
11	(\$375,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of three hundred seventy-five		
12	thousand dollars (\$375,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to provide for 50 nursing		
13	faculty scholarships in accordance with Article 9H of Chapter 90 of the General		
14	Statutes, enacted in Section 1 of this act.		
15	SECTION 2.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State		
16	Education Assistance Authority the sum of three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars		
17	(\$375,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for 50 additional nursing faculty scholarships		
18	in accordance with Article 9H of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, enacted in Section		
19	1 of this act.		
20	SECTION 2.(c) The funds appropriated in this section must be matched by		
21	the university, community college, or hospital school of nursing with a like amount of		
22	non-State funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis.		
23	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
