Whereas, the Town of Godwin, located in northeast Cumberland County about one mile east of the Cape Fear River in a one-half square mile area between the Coastal Plain and the Piedmont, developed around the area's post office and railroad depot; and

Whereas, Godwin was named for the Town's first postmaster, Isaac William Godwin, who served in the North Carolina House of Representatives in 1876 and 1877; and

Whereas, Representative Isaac William Godwin was instrumental in locating the railroad depot for the Wilmington and Weldon Railroad in what was to become the Town of Godwin; and

Whereas, Godwin was chartered by the General Assembly on March 6, 1905; and

Whereas, Godwin's first officers were Mayor Hector McIntyre and Commissioners J.W. McLean, J.M. Starling, and J.W. Deans; Clerk and Treasurer D.L. Pridgen; and Chief of Police William C. Sills; and

Whereas, the railroad was instrumental in the early growth and development of Godwin, providing the means for the Town's residents to distribute their products to other parts of the State and country; and

Whereas, Godwin's residents once produced large quantities of tar, turpentine, and ship masts and grew cotton, tobacco, corn, wheat, and soybeans; and

Whereas, Godwin was once the location of several general and grocery stores, a cotton gin, a blacksmith shop, and a nearby mill; and

Whereas, Godwin gained its first school in 1905 after the consolidation of three neighborhood one-room schools, and it remained open until 1954; and

Whereas, some of Godwin's oldest structures include the Godwin Presbyterian Church, founded in 1904, Godwin Baptist Church, founded in 1907, and Black's Chapel United Methodist Church, founded in 1876; and
