5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the			
7	Community Colleges System Office the sum of twenty-eight million seven hundred			
8	twenty-two thousand ninety-four dollars (\$28,722,094) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to			
9	increase the salaries of full-time, curriculum community college faculty and			
10	professional staff.			
11	SECTION 2.(a) The minimum salaries for community college faculty shall			
12	be based on the following education levels:			
13	(1) Vocational Diploma/Certificate or Less. – This education level			
14	includes faculty members who are high school graduates, have			
15	vocational diplomas, or have completed one year of college.			
16	(2) Associates Degree or Equivalent. – This education level includes			
17	faculty members who have an associates degree or have completed			
18	two or more years of college but have no degree.			
19	(3) Bachelors Degree.			
20	(4) Masters Degree or Education Specialist.			
21	(5) Doctoral Degree.			
22	SECTION 2.(b) For the 2006-2007 school year, the minimum salaries for			
23	nine-month, full-time, curriculum community college faculty shall be as follows:
