18		inclusion in the Program for State funding shall be established by the
19		Soil and Water Conservation Commission. The Soil and Water
20		Conservation Commission shall allocate the cost share and technical
21		assistance funds under the Program.
22	<u>(2)</u>	Areas shall be included in the Program as the funds are appropriated
23		and technical assistance becomes available from the local Soil and
24		Water Conservation District.
25	<u>(3)</u>	Funding may be provided to assist community conservation practices

7	subdivision (5) of subsection (b) of this section, findings regarding the effectiveness of
8	each project to accomplish its primary purpose, and any recommendations to assure that
9	State funding is used in the most cost-effective manner and accomplishes the greatest
10	improvement in water quality."
11	SECTION 2. G.S. 14-234(d3) reads as rewritten:
12	"(d3) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to an application for or the
13	receipt of a grant under the Agriculture Cost Share Program for Nonpoint Source
14	Pollution Control created pursuant to G.S. 143-215.74 Part 9 of Article 21 of Chapter
15	143 of the General Statutes or the Community Conservation Assistance Program created
16	pursuant to Part 11 of Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes by a member of
17	the Soil and Water Conservation Commission if the requirements of G.S. 139-4(e) are
18	met, and does not apply to a district supervisor of a soil and water conservation district
19	if the requirements of G.S. 139-8(b) are met."
20	SECTION 3. G.S. 139-4(d) and (e) read as rewritten:
21	"(d) In addition to the duties and powers hereinafter conferred upon the Soil and
22	Water Conservation Commission, it shall have the following duties and powers:
23	
24	(9) To create, implement, and supervise the Agriculture Cost Share
25	Program for Nonpoint Source Pollution Control pursuant to
26	G.S. 143-215.74 created pursuant to Part 9 of Article 21 of Chapter
27	143 of the General Statutes and the Community Conservation
28	Assistance Program created pursuant to Part 11 of Article 21 of
29	Chapter 143 of the General Statutes.
30	(10) To review and approve or disapprove the application of a district
31	supervisor for a grant under the Agriculture Cost Share Program for
32	Nonpoint Source Pollution Control or the Community Conservation
33	Assistance Program as provided by G.S. 139-8(13).139-8(b).

35	(e) A member of the Commission may apply for and receive a grant under the
36	Agriculture Cost Share Program for Nonpoint Source Pollution Control and the
37	Community Conservation Assistance Program if:
38	(1) The member does not vote on the application or attempt to influence
39	the outcome of any action on the application; and
40	(2) The application is approved by the Secretary of Environment and
41	Natural Resources."
42	SECTION 4. G.S. 139-8(b) reads as rewritten:
43	"(b) A district supervisor may apply for and receive a grant under the Agriculture
44	Cost Share Program for Nonpoint Source Pollution Control created pursuant to Part 9 of

1	Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes or the Community Conservation
2	Assistance Program created pursuant to Part 11 of Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the
3	General Statutes if:
4	1. The district supervisor does not vote on the application or attempt to
5	influence the outcome of any action on the application; and
6	2. The application is approved by the Commission."
7	SECTION 5. The Community Conservation Assistance Program Advisory
8	Committee shall review the Program prior to expenditure of any funds from the
9	Program. The Advisory Committee shall report on the findings of its Program review to
10	the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
11	the Chairs of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of
12	Representatives, the Director of the Fiscal Research Division of the Legislative Services
13	Office, and the Environmental Review Commission no later than 31 March 2007.
14	SECTION 6. The first report required pursuant to G.S. 143-215.74M(e), as
15	enacted by Section 1 of this act, is due on or before 31 January 2008.
16	SECTION 7. This act is effective when it becomes law.
