A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE MANDATORY COST-OF-LIVING INCREASES TO  
3 RETIREES OF THE TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT  
4 SYSTEM EQUAL TO THE COST-OF-LIVING PAY INCREASE GIVEN TO  
5 STATE EMPLOYEES.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7       **SECTION 1.** G.S. 135-5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

8       "(ooo) Effective July 1, 2006, and each July 1 thereafter, the retirement allowance to  
9 or on account of beneficiaries whose retirement commenced on or before July 1 of the  
10 previous year shall be increased by the same percentage as the cost-of-living salary  
11 increase provided to State employees for the fiscal year commencing on July 1 of the  
12 current year. Furthermore, from and after July 1, 2006, and each July 1 thereafter, the  
13 retirement allowance to or on account of beneficiaries whose retirement commenced  
14 after July 1 of the previous year but before June 30 of the current year shall be increased  
15 by a prorated amount of the same percentage as the cost-of-living salary increase  
16 provided to State employees for the fiscal year commencing on July 1 of the current  
17 year, payable as determined by the Board of Trustees based upon the number of months  
18 that a retirement allowance was paid between July 1 of the previous year and June 30 of  
19 the current year."

20       **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
