A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT REQUIRING COMPANY POLICE AGENCIES TO NOTIFY THE CITY OF  
2 WINSTON-SALEM POLICE DEPARTMENT WHEN THEY ARE PROVIDING  
3 ON-SITE POLICE SECURITY PERSONNEL SERVICES WITHIN THE  
4 DEPARTMENT'S TERRITORIAL AND EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION  
5 AND TO PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT WITH CERTAIN INFORMATION ON  
6 ARRESTS MADE BY THE AGENCIES.

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 74E-13 is amended by adding the following new  
10 subsection to read:

11 "(d) A company police agency certified under this Chapter shall notify the  
12 Winston-Salem Police Department if the agency is providing on-site police security  
13 personnel services for persons or property within the Police Department's territorial  
14 jurisdiction, including the Department's one-mile extraterritorial jurisdiction as defined  
15 in G.S. 160A-286. The notification shall include the names of all physical locations  
16 where services are being provided and the beginning and ending dates of all contracts  
17 for service for each location. A company police agency shall also submit, in writing, to  
18 the Police Department the following information on all arrests made by the agency  
19 within the Police Department's territorial jurisdiction, including the one-mile  
20 extraterritorial jurisdiction: (i) the name and address of the individual arrested; (ii) the  
21 offense for which the individual was arrested; and (iii) the date and location of the  
22 offense."

23 **SECTION 2.** This act applies only to the City of Winston-Salem and  
24 company police agencies providing on-site police security personnel services for  
25 persons or property within the City of Winston-Salem.

26 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
