| 6 | Whereas, high blood pressure is the leading cause of stroke; and |
| 7 | Whereas, stroke is the 3 rd leading cause of death in North Carolina; and |
| 8 | Whereas, North Carolina has the fourth highest stroke death rate in the United |
| 9 | States; and |
| 10 | Whereas, the eastern counties of North Carolina, the coastal plains region of |
| 11 | Georgia, and South Carolina have consistently had the very highest stroke death rates in |
| 12 | the nation for the past 30 years; and |
| 13 | Whereas, stroke is a major public health issue among all of North Carolina's |
| 14 | racial and ethnic groups; and |
| 15 | Whereas, 80% of all strokes are estimated to be preventable; and |
| 16 | Whereas, an analysis of the economic burden of stroke estimated |
| 17 | conservatively that stroke costs North Carolina \$1.05 billion annually; and |
| 18 | Whereas, the Strike Out Stroke Program was originally funded through a pilot |
| 19 | grant from the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute of the National Institute of |
| 20 | Health to address hypertension in high risk groups; and |
| 21 | Whereas, the Strike Out Stroke Program has received nonrecurring State |
| 22 | funds for the last six years to provide patient education, professional education, and |

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public awareness; and

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Whereas, if State funds are provided on a recurring basis, then matching federal funds may become available on a five-to-one basis to enhance program activities and effectiveness; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to enhance program activities and effectiveness of the Strike Out Stroke Program. It is the intent of the General Assembly that these funds shall be appropriated on a recurring basis in order to draw down available federal matching funds for the Strike Out Stroke Program.

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
