2	AN ACT TO ALLOW THE TOWN OF OAK RIDGE TO MAKE VOLUNTARY
3	ANNEXATIONS WITHIN A CERTAIN DESCRIBED AREA.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Section 1.2 of the Charter of the Town of Oak Ridge, being
6	S.L. 1998-113, reads as rewritten:
7	"Section 1.2. (a) Except as provided by subsection (c) of this section, Article 4A of
8	Chapter 160A of the General Statutes does not apply to the Town of Oak Ridge until
9	July 1, 2018.
10	(b) G.S. 160A-58.1(b)(2) does not apply to (i) the City of Greensboro as it relates
11	to the Town of Oak Ridge or (ii) the Town of Kernersville as it relates to the Town of
12	Oak Ridge.
13	(c) Parts 1 and 4 of Article 4A of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes apply to
14	the Town of Oak Ridge as to the following described territory in Guilford County:
15	Beginning at a point located at the intersection of Haw River Road and the
16	Forsyth/Guilford County line; thence following the Forsyth/Guilford County line north
17	to the point at which the Forsyth/Guilford County line intersects with the corporate
18	limits of the Town of Stokesdale; thence continuing in an easterly and southeasterly
19	direction following the Town of Stokesdale corporate limits to Haw River Road at
20	which point the Town of Oak Ridge corporate limits begin; thence continuing
21	southwesterly along the southern right-of-way of Haw River Road to the point and place
22	of beginning."
23	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
