A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT REMOVING THE CAP ON SATELLITE ANNEXATIONS FOR THE CITY 3 OF GREENVILLE. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 160A-58.1(b)(5) reads as rewritten: A noncontiguous area proposed for annexation must meet all of the following 6 7 standards: 8 9 (5) The area within the proposed satellite corporate limits, when added to 10 the area within all other satellite corporate limits, may not exceed ten 11 percent (10%) of the area within the primary corporate limits of the 12 annexing city. This subdivision does not apply to the Cities of Claremont, 13 14 Concord, Conover, Gastonia, Greenville, Hickory, Locust, Marion, Mount Airy, Mount Holly, New Bern, Newton, Oxford, Randleman, 15 16 Rockingham, Sanford, Salisbury, Southport, Statesville, 17 Washington and the Towns of Angier, Bladenboro, Calabash, Catawba, Creswell, Dallas, Fuguay-Varina, Garner, Godwin, Holly 18 Ridge, Holly Springs, Kenly, Knightdale, Leland, Louisburg, Maiden, 19
