March 24, 2005 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH CAROLINA NATUROPATHIC 3 PHYSICIANS REGISTRATION ACT. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read: 6 7 "Article 40. 8 "Naturopathic Physicians Registration. 9 "§ 90-680. Short title. 10 This act may be cited as the 'North Carolina Naturopathic Physicians Registration 11 Act'. 12 "§ 90-681. Intent; purpose. The General Assembly finds that a significant number of residents of the 13 (a) 14 State of North Carolina choose complementary and alternative health care and declares that naturopathic medicine is a distinct health care profession that affects the public 15 16 health, safety, and welfare and provides for freedom of choice in health care. The 17 General Assembly concludes that regulation is in the current interest of North Carolina citizens to aid in protecting them from deception, fraud, and damage to their health 18 status. Registration can provide a process by which citizens may more confidently rely 19 20 with respect to the level of skill, education, and competency possessed by registered 21 persons. 22 The purpose of this act is to provide standards for the registration of (b) 23 naturopathic physicians desiring to practice naturopathic medicine in this State. This act recognizes that many of the therapies used by naturopathic physicians, such as the use 24 25 of nutritional supplements, herbs, foods, homeopathic preparations, and such physical forces as heat, cold, water, touch, and light are not the exclusive privilege of 26 naturopathic physicians. This act does not prohibit the use, practice, or administration of 27 28 these therapies by a person not licensed or registered to practice naturopathic medicine

21	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
