A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL RESOURCES FOR LOW-PERFORMING 3 HIGH SCHOOLS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 18C-164(c) reads as rewritten: 5 "§ 18C-164. Transfer of net revenues. 6 7 The funds remaining in the North Carolina State Lottery Fund after receipt of (a) 8 all revenues to the Lottery Fund and after accrual of all obligations of the Commission 9 for prizes and expenses shall be considered to be the net revenues of the North Carolina State Lottery Fund. The net revenues of the North Carolina State Lottery Fund shall be 10 transferred periodically to the Education Lottery Fund, which shall be created in the 11 12 State treasury. From the Education Lottery Fund, the Commission shall transfer a sum equal 13 (b) to five percent (5%) of the net revenue of the prior year to the Education Lottery 14 Reserve Fund. A special revenue fund for this purpose shall be established in the State 15 treasury to be known as the Education Lottery Reserve Fund, and that fund shall be 16 capped at fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000). Monies in the Education Lottery Reserve 17 Fund may be appropriated only as provided in subsection (e) of this section. 18 The Commission shall distribute the remaining net revenue of the Education 19 (c) Lottery Fund, as follows, in the following manner: 20 A sum equal to fifty percent (50%) to support reduction of class size in 21 (1)22 early grades to class size allotments not exceeding 1:18 in order to eliminate achievement gaps and gaps, to support academic 23 prekindergarten programs for at-risk four-year-olds who would 24 otherwise not be served in a high-quality education program in order to 25 help those four-year-olds be prepared developmentally to succeed in 26 school.school, and for the 2006-2007 through the 2010-2011 fiscal 27
