A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION FOUNDATION OF NORTH CAROLINA TO HELP EXPAND NORTH 3 CAROLINA'S STATEWIDE REVOLVING FUND HISTORIC 4 FOR 5 PRESERVATION. Whereas, North Carolina has created the nation's first and most successful 6 7 statewide revolving fund for historic preservation through the work of a nonprofit 8 corporation known as the Historic Preservation Foundation of North Carolina, Inc., 9 ("Preservation North Carolina"); and Whereas, the 1977, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, and 1987 Sessions of the 10 North Carolina General Assembly recognized the value of a statewide revolving fund 11 for saving many important historic buildings in North Carolina by appropriating to 12 Preservation North Carolina grants-in-aid totaling \$815,000; and 13 14 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina has raised over \$30,000,000 in cash, property, and other revenues from the private sector (foundations, corporations, and 15 individuals) since the 1977 General Assembly made its first appropriation to 16 Preservation North Carolina; and 17 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina has succeeded in saving more than 550 18 endangered historic properties in more than 60 counties throughout the State, attracting 19 more than \$200,000,000 in private investments and thus enhancing the property tax 20 21 bases of their respective cities and counties; and 22 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina now has operations and staff in 23 Wilmington, Edenton, Hillsborough, Glencoe (Alamance County), Raleigh, Winston-Salem, and Shelby; and 24 25 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina is currently working to save more than 35 endangered historic properties throughout North Carolina, including several large 26 historic industrial properties, and it is working with numerous local preservation 27

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organizations to save other properties through the Association of North Carolina
Revolving Funds; and

Whereas, Preservation North Carolina has had to forego many other worthy
preservation projects for lack of revolving fund capital; and

5 Whereas, the projects with which Preservation North Carolina is currently 6 working will leverage private investments in excess of \$60,000,000, money which will 7 substantially enhance state and local tax bases; and

8 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina has carried on programs since 1939 in 9 support of the Department of Cultural Resources, local preservation organizations, and 10 local governments through the purchase of endangered historic properties, 11 dissemination of technical information about historic preservation, and recognition of 12 worthy preservation, activities; and

Whereas, the State of North Carolina should help this private organization, which is encouraging quality economic development in North Carolina communities, with a onetime nonrecurring appropriation to aid in recapitalizing its revolving fund; Now, therefore,

17 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

18 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Historic 19 Preservation Foundation of North Carolina, Inc., for the 2006-2007 fiscal year the sum 20 of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the purpose of expanding 21 North Carolina's statewide revolving fund for historic preservation.

22 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
