2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE INCREASED SECURITY FOR DRIVERS LICENSES.		
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
4	SECTION 1. Subsection (b1) of G.S. 20-7 reads as rewritten:		
5	"(b1) Application. – To obtain an identification card, learners permit, or drivers		
6	license from the Division, a person shall complete an application form provided by the		
7	Division, present at least two forms of identification approved by the Commissioner, be		
8	a resident of this State, and, except for an identification card, demonstrate his or her		
9	physical and mental ability to drive safely a motor vehicle included in the class of		
10	license for which the person has applied.		
11	At least one of the forms of identification shall indicate the applicant's residence		
12	address. At least one of the forms of identification shall contain evidence that the		
13	applicant is either a citizen of the United States or is an alien lawfully admitted for		
14	permanent or temporary residence in the United States.		
15	The Division may copy the identification documents presented or and hold it those		
16	documents for a brief period of time to verify its their authenticity.		
17	If required by federal law, the Division shall copy the identification documents		
18	presented and hold those copies for at least seven years.		
19	To obtain an endorsement, a person shall demonstrate his or her physical and mental		
20	ability to drive safely the type of motor vehicle for which the endorsement is required.		
21	The application form shall request all of the following information, and it shall		
22	contain the disclosures concerning the request for an applicant's social security number		
23	required by section 7 of the federal Privacy Act of 1974, Pub. L. No. 93-579:		
24	(1) The applicant's full name.		
25	(2) The applicant's mailing address and <u>principal</u> residence address.		
26	(3) A physical description of the applicant, including the applicant's sex,		
27	height, eye color, and hair color.

(6)(7) The applicant's signature. 22 23 If an applicant does not have a valid social security number and is ineligible to 24 obtain one, the applicant shall swear to or affirm that fact under penalty of perjury. In such case, the applicant may provide a valid Individual Taxpayer Identification Number 25 issued by the Internal Revenue Service to that person. 26 The Division shall not issue an identification card, learners permit, or drivers license 27 to an applicant who fails to provide either the applicant's valid social security number or 28 the applicant's valid Individual Taxpayer Identification Number.comply with the 29 requirements of subdivisions (1) through (7) of this subsection. 30 The Division shall not accept any foreign document, other than an official passport, 31 32 to satisfy the requirements of this subsection. Before issuing a drivers license or identification card to a person, the Division shall 33 verify, with the issuing agency, the issuance, validity, and completeness of each 34 document required to be presented by the person pursuant to this subsection. 35 This verification requirement shall be accomplished by the Commissioner entering 36 into a memorandum of understanding with the Secretary of Homeland Security to 37 38 routinely use the automated system known as Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements, as provided for by section 404 of the Illegal Immigration Reform and 39 Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (110 Stat. 3009-664), to verify the legal presence 40 status of a person, other than a United States citizen, applying for a drivers license or an 41 42 identification card.

4	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-7(b3) reads as rewritten:			
5	"(b3) The Division shall adopt rules implementing the provisions of subsection (b1)			
6	of this section with respect to proof of residency in this State. Those rules shall ensure			
7				
8	that applicants submit verified or verifiable residency and address information that can be reasonably considered to be valid and that is provided on any of the following:			
9	(1) A document issued by an agency of the United States or by the			
10	government of another nation. States.			
11	(2) A document issued by another state.			
12	(3) A document issued by the State of North Carolina, or a political			
12	subdivision of this State. This includes an agency or instrumentality of			
14	this State.			
15	(4) A preprinted bank or other corporate statement.			
16	(5) A preprinted business letterhead.			
17	(6) Any other document deemed reliable by the Division."			
18	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-7(b4) reads as rewritten:			
19	"(b4) Examples of documents that are reasonably reliable indicators of residency			
20	and principal residence include, but are not limited to, any of the following:			
21	(1) A pay stub with the payee's address.			
22	(2) A utility bill showing the address of the applicant-payor.			
23	(3) A contract for an apartment, house, modular unit, or manufactured			
24	home with a North Carolina address signed by the applicant.			
25	(4) A receipt for personal property taxes paid.			
26	(5) A receipt for real property taxes paid to a North Carolina locality.			
27	(6) A current automobile insurance policy issued to the applicant and			
28	showing the applicant's address.			
29	(7) A monthly or quarterly financial statement from a North Carolina			
30	regulated financial institution.			
31	(8) A matricula consular or substantially similar document issued by the			
32	Mexican Consulate for North Carolina.			
33	(9) A document similar to that described in subsection (8) of this section,			
34	issued by the consulate or embassy of another country. This			
35	subdivision only applies if the Division has consulted with the United			
36	State Department of State and is satisfied with the reliability of such			
37	document."			
38	SECTION 4. G.S. 20-7(b5) reads as rewritten:			
39	"(b5) The Division rules adopted pursuant to subsection (b3) of this section shall			
40	also provide that if <u>ana minor</u> applicant cannot produce any documentation specified in			
41	subsection (b3) or (b4) of this section, the applicant, or in the case of a minor applicant			
42	a parent or legal guardian of the <u>minor</u> applicant, may complete an affidavit, on a form			
43	provided by the Division and sworn to before an official of the Division, indicating the minor applicant's current residence address. No parent or guardian who does not have a			
44	minor applicant's current residence address. No parent or guardian who does not have a			

valid drivers license or valid identification card or who has obtained their drivers license 1 2 by affidavit may subsequently complete an affidavit for a minor applicant unless that 3 parent provides satisfactory documentation of residence and citizenship as required by this section. The affidavit shall contain the provisions of G.S. 20-15(a) and 4 5 G.S. 20-17(a)(5) G.S. 20-15(a), 20-17(a)(5), and 20-31, and shall indicate the civil and 6 criminal penalties for completing a false affidavit." **SECTION 5.** G.S. 20-7(f) reads as rewritten: 7 8 "(f) Expiration and Temporary License. - The first drivers license the Division 9 issues to a person expires on the person's fourth or subsequent birthday that occurs after 10 the license is issued and on which the individual's age is evenly divisible by five, unless this subsection sets a different expiration date. A first drivers license may shall be 11 12 issued for a shorter duration if the Division determines that a license of shorter duration should be issued when the applicant holds to expire upon the expiration date of a visa of 13 14 limited duration issued by the United States Department of State. of Homeland Security. 15 The first drivers license the Division issues to a person who is at least 17 years old but is less than 18 years old expires on the person's twentieth birthday. The first drivers 16 17 license the Division issues to a person who is at least 62 years old expires on the 18 person's birthday in the fifth year after the license is issued, whether or not the person's age on that birthday is evenly divisible by five. 19 20 A drivers license that was issued by the Division and is renewed by the Division 21 expires five years after the expiration date of the license that is renewed unless the Division determines that a license of shorter duration should shall be issued to expire on 22 23 the expiration date of a valid alien registration when the applicant holds a visa-valid 24 alien registration of limited duration from the United States Department of State. Homeland Security. A person may apply to the Division to renew a license during the 25 180-day period before the license expires. The Division may not accept an application 26 27 for renewal made before the 180 day period begins. Any license issued to a noncitizen shall automatically expire when the applicant's presence is no longer authorized under 28 federal law. The expiration date on the license shall reflect the expiration date of the 29 applicant's authorized presence in the United States as verified by the United States 30 Department of Homeland Security. 31 32 The Division may renew by mail a drivers license issued by the Division to a person who meets any of the following descriptions: 33 Is serving on active duty in the armed forces of the United States and 34 (1)35 is stationed outside this State. Is a resident of this State and has been residing outside the State for at 36 (2)least 30 continuous days. 37 38 When renewing a license by mail, the Division may waive the examination that 39 would otherwise be required for the renewal and may impose any conditions it finds advisable. A license renewed by mail is a temporary license that expires 60 days after 40 the person to whom it is issued returns to this State. 41 42 Except for an applicant providing a verified social security account number, the Division shall, if all other requirements of this section are met, issue a temporary license 43 valid for 10 days to the applicant and shall mail the drivers license to the applicant, by 44

36		requirements. – The Division shall:	
37	(1)	Employ technology to capture digital images of identity source	
38		documents so that the images can be retained in electronic storage in a	
39		transferable format.	
40	(2)	Retain paper copies of source documents for a minimum of seven	
41	<u> </u>	years or digital images of source documents for a minimum of 10	
42		years.	
43	<u>(3)</u>	If required by federal law, subject each person applying for a drivers	
44		license or identification card to mandatory facial image capture.	
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1	<u>(4)</u>	Establish an effective procedure to confirm or verify a renewing
2		applicant's information.
3	<u>(5)</u>	Confirm with the Social Security Administration a social security
4		account number presented by an applicant using the full social security
5		account number. In the event that a social security account number is
6		already registered or associated with another person to whom any State
7		has issued a drivers license or identification card, the Division shall
8		resolve the discrepancy and take appropriate action.
9	<u>(6)</u>	Refuse to issue a drivers license or identification card to a person

12	<u>(7)</u>	Ensure the physical security of locations where drivers licenses and
13		identification cards are produced and the security of document
14		materials and papers from which drivers licenses and identification
15		cards are produced.
16	<u>(8)</u>	Subject all persons authorized to manufacture or produce drivers
17		licenses and identification cards to appropriate security clearance
18		requirements.
19	<u>(9)</u>	Establish fraudulent document recognition training programs for
20		appropriate employees who engage in the issuance of drivers licenses
21		and identification cards.
22	<u>(10)</u>	Limit the period of all drivers licenses and identification cards that are
23		not temporary to a period that does not exceed eight years.
24	<u>(11)</u>	In any case in which the State issues a drivers license or identification
25		card that does not satisfy the requirements of this subsection, ensure
26		that the license or identification card:
27		a. <u>Clearly states on its face that it may not be accepted by any</u>
28		federal agency for any official purpose.
29		b. Uses a unique design or color indicator to alert the federal
30		agency or other law enforcement personnel that it may not be
31		accepted for any official purpose."
