Referred to: Judiciary I. March 9, 2005 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CREATE THE CRIMINAL OFFENSE OF UNAUTHORIZED LASER ILLUMINATION OF AN AIRCRAFT. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Article 36 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 14-282.1. Unauthorized laser illumination of an aircraft. The following definitions apply to this section: (a) (1) "Aircraft" is as defined in G.S. 63-1. "Laser" is as defined in G.S. 14-34.8. (2) Any person who, intentionally and without legal authorization, illuminates an aircraft with a laser while the aircraft is taking off, landing, or in flight is guilty of a Class H felony." **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
