5	SECT	FION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Cumberland		
6	County the sun	n of seven hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$725,000) for the		
7	2005-2006 fisca	Il year to aid the county with community development projects. These		
8	funds shall be allocated as follows:			
9	(1)	\$200,000 to acquire and develop land for the Martin Luther King		
10		Parks for tourism development and attraction of economic		
11		development.		
12	(2)	\$150,000 for the Cumberland Regional Improvement Corporation to		
13		acquire and develop land for affordable homes.		
14	(3)	\$50,000 for HIV/STD prevention and education in the Cape Fear		
15		region.		
16	(4)	\$25,000 to purchase equipment and develop staff for The Bicycle Man		
17		program.		
18	(5)	\$50,000 to support the Old Wilmington Road Association youth		
19		programs, including tutoring and summer field trips.		
20	(6)	\$25,000 to aid the E.E. Smith youth programs, including after-school		
21		mentoring, Steel Magnolias and Brothers Keeper.		
22	(7)	\$25,000 to support the Downtown Chess and Checker Club in its		
23		efforts to mentor children and provide a facility for senior citizens.		
24	(8)	\$50,000 to aid Fayetteville State University's choir.		
25	(9)	\$100,000 to support the Washington Street Elementary School		
26		Rehabilitation, which will be used as senior citizen apartments and a		
27		community and medical center.		
28	(10)	\$25,000 to provide support for the Multicultural Museum's collections		
29		of African-American military memorabilia.		

(11) \$25,000 to support the Alpha Academy's programs for children.
SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
