A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR PUBLIC HEALTH INCUBATORS.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of two million five hundred 5 thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year. These funds shall be 6 allocated to the North Carolina Institute for Public Health, School of Public Health at 7 8 the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill to coordinate the development of "public health incubators". Core participants in these incubators will be local public 9 health departments in selected underserved regions. Other governmental agencies and 10 nonprofit organizations will also be invited to participate. The funds shall be used to 11 provide ongoing public health incubator projects in the four public health incubators 12 currently established at the rate of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to each 13 14 of the four incubators, with the remaining appropriation to be allocated to up to four additional regional public health incubators selected by a selection committee. The 15 selection committee shall consist of a representative of the North Carolina Association 16 of Local Health Directors, a representative of the North Carolina Public Health 17 Association, two representatives from each currently funded public health incubator, a 18 representative of the Division of Public Health of the Department of Health and Human 19 Services, and two representatives from the North Carolina Institute for Public Health. 20 The North Carolina Institute for Public Health may use up to two hundred fifty thousand 21 22 dollars (\$250,000) for special projects and administrative expenses. The funds shall be 23 used to: 24

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Establish or strengthen the capacity to conduct epidemiological (1)investigation and to actively monitor public health conditions, diseases, and risk factors.

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1	(2)	Establish or strengthen the capacity to monitor health disparities and to
2		develop plans to reduce those disparities.
3	(3)	Conduct regional community health assessments with the assistance of
4		other members of the public health community, including other
5		governmental agencies and nonprofit organizations, to establish
6		partnership health priorities based on these findings, and to draft public
7		health interventions to address the highest health priorities.
8	(4)	Raise public awareness of the health-related issues in partnership
9	~ /	communities, collaborating with members of the larger public health
10		community and with local and State media, reporting health issues to
11		the county commissioners, the boards of health, legislators, at-risk
12		groups, and to the community at large.
13	(5)	Provide regular, supplemental training to members of the participating
14		boards of health to inform them about their overall responsibilities,
15		including their role in policy development, to introduce them to
16		evidence-based best practices in public health with an emphasis on
17		collaborative initiatives, and to update them on emerging public health
18		issues, particularly those that are of greatest concern to their
19		communities.
20	(6)	Conduct workforce preparedness assessments and follow-on training
21		for the public health workforce in the pilot regions and to establish or
22 23		supplement policy to facilitate effective responses to public health
23		emergencies where appropriate.
24	(7)	Assist the accreditation administrator in the review of partnership
25		health departments and assist in remediation where necessary, through
26		collaborative efforts.
27	(8)	Establish a formal, systematic review of the incubators to track and
28		evaluate the efficacy of roles, organization, and programs, to identify
29		best practices, and to develop recommendations for improvement
30		based on these findings.
31		FION 2. The Department of Health and Human Services shall report on
32	the use of the	se funds and an evaluation of the incubator efforts to the Senate
33	Appropriations

35		Division. The Department shall submit the report October 1, 2005, and
