4	CONVICTED OF HAVING FRAUDULENTLY OBTAINED THE
5	COMPENSATION.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 97-88.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
8	"(a1) Any compensation that an employee is receiving under G.S. 97-29 or
9	G.S. 97-30 shall be terminated, and the employee is not entitled to compensation under
10	G.S. 97-31 when the employee is convicted under subsection (a) of this section for
11	making a false statement or representation in order to obtain the compensation. This
12	subsection does not apply to any benefit or payment the employee receives as medical
13	compensation under G.S. 97-25."
14	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective October 1, 2005, and applies to all
15	agreements approved by the North Carolina Industrial Commission under the Workers'
16	Compensation Act, Article 1 of Chapter 97 of the General Statutes, that are approved on
17	or after that date; all orders or decisions of the North Carolina Industrial Commission
18	under the Workers' Compensation Act that are entered on or after that date; and all
19	awards of the North Carolina Industrial Commission unappealed from or affirmed upon
20	appeal under the Workers' Compensation Act that are awarded on or after that date.

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
