A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR VARIOUS YOUTH PROJECTS IN  
2 EDGECOMBE AND NASH COUNTIES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Bridging the  
6 Gap of Eastern North Carolina, Inc., a nonprofit organization, the sum of one hundred  
7 fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year to provide support  
8 services to youth in Edgecombe and Nash Counties. These funds shall be allocated as  
9 follows:

- 10 (1) \$50,000 for the Adolescents Pursuing Purpose Thru Leadership  
11 Enhancement (APPLE) Program, a juvenile reentry program for young  
12 males.  
13 (2) \$50,000 for the Mentoring Children of Prisoners' Project, which  
14 matches mentors with children from Edgecombe and Nash Counties  
15 who have a parent incarcerated in a State or federal prison.  
16 (3) \$50,000 for the Edgecombe and Nash Counties Out-of-School Project,  
17 which provides youth with mentoring and tutorial support.

18 **SECTION 2.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Edgecombe  
19 County the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year  
20 to support the One Plus One Equals Success Program, a summer math and reading  
21 tutorial program for children in kindergarten through eighth grade.

22 **SECTION 2.(b)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Nash  
23 County the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year  
24 to support the One Plus One Equals Success Program, a summer math and reading  
25 tutorial program for children in kindergarten through eighth grade.

26 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
