Short Title: Special Plates for Wildlife Commissioners. (Public)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES FOR COMMISSIONERS OF THE WILDLIFE RESOURCES COMMISSION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-79.5 reads as rewritten:

"§ 20-79.5. (Effective July 1, 2007) Special registration plates for elected and appointed State government officials.

(a) Plates. – The State government officials listed in this section are eligible for a special registration plate under G.S. 20-79.4. The plate shall bear the number designated in the following table for the position held by the official.

30 (b) Designation. – When the table in subsection (a) designates a range of
 31 numbers for certain officials, the number given an official in that group shall be
 32 assigned. The Governor shall assign a number for members of the Governor's staff,
 33 nonlegislative members of the Board of Economic Development, nonlegislative
 34 members of the State Ports Authority, members of State boards and commissions, and
 35 for State employees. The Attorney General shall assign a number for the Attorney
 36 General's deputies and assistants.

37 The first number assigned to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission is
 38 reserved for the Chair of that Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned to
 39 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission members on the basis of seniority. The
 40 first number assigned to the Utilities Commission is reserved for the Chair of that
 41 Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned to the Utilities Commission
 42 members on the basis of seniority. The first number assigned to the Parole Commission
 43 is reserved for the Chair of that Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned
 44 to the Parole Commission members on the basis of seniority. The first number assigned

1 to the Wildlife Resources Commission is reserved for the Chair of that Commission.
2 The remaining numbers shall be assigned to the Wildlife Resources Commission
3 members on the basis of seniority."

4 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
