38	Education Assistance Authority pursuant to rules adopted by the SEAA not inconsistent

40	(f) The SEAA shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight		
41	Committee by December 1, 2009, and by each December 1 thereafter, regarding the		
42	Fund and grants awarded from the Fund. The report shall cover the previous academic		
43	year and contain the total amount of grants disbursed from the Fund, the number of

1	students eligible for the grants, the number of eligible students who received the grants,			
2	and a distribution of the grants by institutions of higher education.			
3	(g) Unexpended grant funds shall remain in the Fund for future grants to be			
4	disbursed under this section."			
5	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State			
6	Education Assistance Authority the sum of twenty-eight million six hundred thousand			
7	dollars (\$28,600,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to be allocated to the North Carolina			
8	College Foundation Grant Fund to implement this act. Notwithstanding the foregoing,			
9	no grant shall be disbursed to an eligible student before July 1, 2008.			
10	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
