A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PERMIT NATIONALLY CERTIFIED TEACHERS WHO BECOME
2 PRINCIPALS OR ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS TO RETAIN THE NBPTS
3 SALARY INCENTIVE AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THIS PURPOSE.
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5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-296.2(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) State Policy. – It is the goal of the State to provide opportunities and
8 incentives for good teachers to become excellent teachers and to retain them in the
9 teaching profession; to attain this goal, the State shall support the efforts of teachers to
10 achieve national certification by providing approved paid leave time for teachers
11 participating in the process, paying the participation fee, and paying a significant salary
12 differential to teachers who attain national certification from the National Board for
13 Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS).

14 It is further the goal of the State to provide teachers who attain national certification
15 from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards with the opportunity to
16 further advance their careers by becoming principals or assistant principals and to use
17 the expertise and abilities they gained as teachers in these new school leadership roles;
18 to attain this goal, the State shall pay the salary differential to teachers with NBPTS
19 certification who become principals or assistant principals.

20 The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) was established
21 in 1987 as an independent, nonprofit organization to establish high standards for
22 teachers' knowledge and performance and for development and operation of a national
23 voluntary system to assess and certify teachers who meet those standards. Participation
24 in the program gives teachers the time and the opportunity to analyze in a systematic
25 way their professional development as teachers, successful teaching strategies, and the
26 substantive areas in which they teach. Participation also gives teachers an opportunity to
27 demonstrate superior ability and to be compensated as superior teachers. To receive
28 NBPTS certification, a teacher must successfully (i) complete a process of developing a

1 portfolio of student work and videotapes of teaching and learning activities and (ii)
2 participate in NBPTS assessment center simulation exercises, including
3 performance-based activities and a content knowledge examination."

4 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
5 Department of Public Instruction the sum of one million seven hundred thousand dollars
6 (\$1,700,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of one million seven hundred
7 thousand dollars (\$1,700,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to implement the provisions
8 of this act.

9 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
