## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO INCREASE THE UNIFORM FEES PAID TO JURORS FOR THEIR
3	SERVICE AND TO RAISE COURT COSTS TO OFFSET THAT INCREASE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 7A-312 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 7A-312. Uniform fees for jurors; meals.
7	A juror in the General Court of Justice including a petit juror, or a coroner's juror,
8	but excluding or a grand juror, shall receive twelve dollars (\$12.00) for the first day of
9	service and twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day afterwards, thirty dollars (\$30.00) per day,
10	except that if any person serves as a juror for more than five days in any 24-month
11	period, the juror shall receive forty dollars (\$40.00) fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day for
12	each day of service in excess of five days. A grand juror shall receive twenty dollars
13	(\$20.00) per day. A juror required to remain overnight at the site of the trial shall be
14	furnished adequate accommodations and subsistence. If required by the presiding judge
15	to remain in a body during the trial of a case, meals shall be furnished the jurors during
16	the period of sequestration. Jurors from out of the county summoned to sit on a special
17	venire shall receive mileage at the same rate as State employees."
18	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 7A-304(a)(4) reads as rewritten:
19	"(4) For support of the General Court of Justice, the sum of eighty five
20	dollars and fifty cents (\$85.50) eighty-nine dollars and fifty cents
21	(\$89.50) in the district court, including cases before a magistrate, and
22	the sum of ninety-two dollars and fifty cents (\$92.50) ninety-six
23	dollars and fifty cents (\$96.50) in the superior court, to be remitted to
24	the State Treasurer. For a person convicted of a felony in superior
25	court who has made a first appearance in district court, both the district
26	court and superior court fees shall be assessed. The State Treasurer
27	shall remit the sum of one dollar and five cents (\$1.05) of each fee
28	collected under this subdivision to the North Carolina State Bar for the
29	provision of services described in G.S. 7A-474.4, and ninety-five cents

1	(\$.95) of each fee collected under this subdivision to the North
2	Carolina State Bar for the provision of services described in
3	G.S. 7A-474.19."
4	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 7A-305(a)(2) reads as rewritten:
5	"(2) For support of the General Court of Justice, the sum of seventy-nine
6	dollars (\$79.00) eighty-three dollars (\$83.00) in the superior court,
7	except that if a case is assigned to a special superior court judge as a
8	complex business case under G.S. 7A-45.3, an additional two hundred
9	dollars (\$200.00) shall be paid upon its assignment, and the sum of
10	sixty four dollars (\$64.00) sixty-eight dollars (\$68.00) in the district
11	court except that if the case is assigned to a magistrate the sum shall be
12	fifty-three dollars (\$53.00). Sums collected under this subdivision shall
13	be remitted to the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall remit the
14	sum of one dollar and five cents (\$1.05) of each fee collected under
15	this subdivision to the North Carolina State Bar for the provision of
16	services described in G.S. 7A-474.4, and ninety-five cents (\$.95) of
17	each fee collected under this subdivision to the North Carolina State
18	Bar for the provision of services described in G.S. 7A-474.19."
19	SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2007, and
20	applies to jury service on or after that date. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July
21	1, 2007, and applies to all costs assessed or collected on or after that date, except that in
22	misdemeanor or infraction cases disposed of on or after that date by written appearance,
23	waiver of trial or hearing, and plea of guilt or admission of responsibility pursuant to
24	G.S. 7A-180(4) or G.S. 7A-273(2), in which the citation or other criminal process was
25	issued before that date, the cost shall be the lesser of those specified in G.S. 7A-304(a),
26	as amended by Section 2 of this act, or those specified in the notice portion of the
27	defendant's or respondent's copy of the citation or other criminal process, if any costs
28	are specified in that notice. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 2007,
29	and applies to costs assessed or collected on or after that date.
