8	(1)	Abuse To physically or mentally harm, harass, intimidate, or	
9		interfere with the personal liberty of another.	
10	(2)	Civil no-contact order. – An order granted under this Chapter, which	
11		includes a remedy authorized by G.S. 50C-5.	
12	(3)	Nonconsensual. – A lack of freely given consent.	
13	(4)	Sexual conduct Any intentional or knowing touching, fondling, or	
14		sexual penetration by a person, either directly or through clothing, of	
15		the sexual organs, anus, or breast of another, whether an adult or a	
16		minor, for the purpose of sexual gratification or arousal. For purposes	
17		of this subdivision, the term shall include the transfer or transmission	
18		of semen.

7		include acts of self-defense or defense of others:
8		a. Nonconsensual sexual conduct, including single incidences of
9		nonconsensual sexual conduct.
10		b. Stalking.
11	(8)	Victim. – A person against whom an act of unlawful conduct has been
12		committed by another person not involved in a personal relationship
13		with the person as defined in G.S. 50B-1(b)."
