1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO DIRECT SOME OF THE FUNDS AVAILABLE UNDER THE JOB
3	DEVELOPMENT INVESTMENT GRANT PROGRAM TOWARDS
4	TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 143B-437.52(c) reads as rewritten:
7	"(c) Ceiling. – Except as provided in this section, the maximum amount of total
8	annual liability for grants for agreements entered into in any single calendar year,
9	including amounts transferred to the Utility Account pursuant to
10	G.S. 143B-437.61,143B-437.61 and to the JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund
11	pursuant to G.S. 143B-437.64, may not exceed fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000).
12	The maximum amount of total annual liability for grants for agreements entered into in
13	2006, including amounts transferred to the Utility Account pursuant to
14	G.S. 143B-437.61, may not exceed thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000). No agreement
15	may be entered into that, when considered together with other existing agreements
16	entered into during that calendar year, could cause the State's potential total annual
17	liability for grants entered into in that calendar year to exceed this amount."
18	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 143B-437.55(c)(13) reads as rewritten:
19	"(c) Annual Reports The Committee shall publish a report on the Job
20	Development Investment Grant Program on or before April 30 of each year. The report
21	shall include the following:
22	
23	(13) The total amount amounts transferred under this Part during the
24	preceding year to the Utility Account of the Industrial Development
25	Fund under this Part during the preceding year. and to the JDIG
26	Transportation Infrastructure Fund."

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1	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 143B-437.56(d) reads as rewritten:
2	"(d) For any eligible position that is located in a development tier three area,
3	seventy-five percent (75%) fifty-five percent (55%) of the annual grant approved for
4	disbursement shall be payable to the business, and twenty-five percent (25%) shall be
5	payable to the Utility Account pursuant to G.S. 143B-437.61.143B-437.61, and twenty
6	percent (20%) shall be payable to the JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund pursuant
7	to G.S. 143B-437.64. For any eligible position that is located in a development tier two
8	area, eighty-five percent (85%) of the annual grant approved for disbursement shall be
9	payable to the business, and fifteen percent (15%) shall be payable to the Utility
10	Account pursuant to G.S. 143B-437.61. A position is located in the development tier
11	area that has been assigned to the county in which the project is located at the time the
12	application is filed with the Committee."
13	<b>SECTION 4.</b> G.S. 143B-437.56(f) reads as rewritten:
14	"(f) The amount of a grant associated with any specific eligible position,
15	including any amount transferred to the Utility Account pursuant to
16	G.S. 143B-437.61,143B-437.61 or to the JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund
17	pursuant to G.S. 143B-437.64, may not exceed six thousand five hundred dollars
18	(\$6,500) in any year."
19	<b>SECTION 5.</b> G.S. 143B-437.57(a)(23) reads as rewritten:
20	"(a) Terms. – Each community economic development agreement shall include at
21	least the following:
22	
23	(23) A provision stating that the amount of a grant associated with any
24	specific eligible position, including any amount transferred to the
25 26	Utility Account pursuant to G.S. <u>143B</u> <u>437.61,143B</u> - <u>437.61</u> and to the
26 27	JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund pursuant to
27	<u>G.S. 143B-437.64</u> , may not exceed six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500) in any year."
28 29	<b>SECTION 6.</b> G.S. 143B-437.61 reads as rewritten:
29 30	"§ 143B-437.61. Transfer to Industrial Development Fund.
31	At the time the Department of Commerce remits a check to a business under
32	G.S. 143B-437.60, the Department of Commerce shall transfer to the Utility Account of
33	the Industrial Development Fund an amount equal to the amount certified by the
34	Committee as the difference between the amount of the grant and the amount of the
35	grant for which the business would be eligible without regard to any amount required to
36	be transferred to the Account under G.S. 143B-437.56(d)."
37	<b>SECTION 7.</b> Part 2G of Article 10 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes
38	is amended by adding a new section to read:
39	" <u>§ 143B-437.64. JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund.</u>
40	(a) Establishment; Use. – The JDIG Transportation Infrastructure Fund is
41	established as a special revenue fund in the Department of Transportation. Fifty percent
42	(50%) of the moneys in the Fund shall be used to fund approved projects in the
43	Transportation Improvement Program, and the remainder shall be used to fund local
44	transportation infrastructure projects. The Fund shall be segregated into separate

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1	accounts for each county, and the funds in an account may be used only for approved
2	projects located in that county. Amounts transferred to the Fund under
3	G.S. 143B-437.56 shall be placed into the account of the county in which the business
4	that generated that amount is located. Units of local government may apply to the
5	Department of Transportation for funds that are reserved for transportation
6	infrastructure projects in the county served by the unit of local government.
7	(b) <u>Transfer to Fund. – At the time the Department of Commerce remits a check</u>
8	to a business under G.S. 143B-437.60, the Department of Commerce shall transfer to
9	the Fund any amount required to be transferred to the Fund under G.S. 143B-437.56(d).
10	(c) <u>Nonsupplant Restriction. – Moneys in the Fund are intended to supplement</u>
11	and not supplant existing funding. Allocations from the Fund for approved projects shall
12	not affect allocations of funds under the Highway Fund or Highway Trust Fund."
13	SECTION 8. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007, and applies to
14	agreements entered into on or after that date.
