A bill containing no substantive provisions may not be 6 introduced in the House of Representatives during the 2008 Regular Session. 7 **SECTION 4.** The Speaker of the House of Representatives or the President 8 Pro Tempore of the Senate may authorize appropriate committees or subcommittees of 9 their respective houses to meet during the interims between sessions to: 10 Review matters related to the State budget for the 2007-2009 (1) 11 biennium, 12 Prepare reports, including revised budgets, or (2) 13 (3) Consider any other matters as the Speaker of the House of 14 Representatives or the President Pro Tempore of the Senate deems 15 appropriate, 16 except that no committee or subcommittee of a house may consider, after the date of 17 adjournment provided in Section 1 of this resolution and before the date of reconvening 18 provided in Section 2 of this resolution, any bill, or proposed committee substitute for 19 such bill, which originated in the other house. A conference committee may meet in the 20 interim upon approval by the Speaker of the House of Representatives or the President 21 Pro Tempore of the Senate. 22 **SECTION 5.** This resolution is effective upon ratification.
