6		SECTION 1. G.S. 116-209.26(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a)	The following definitions apply to this section:
8		(1) Academic year. – A period of time in which a student in matriculated
9		status is expected to complete the equivalent of at least two semesters'
10		or three quarters' academic work.
11		(2) Eligible postsecondary institution. – A school that is: is any of the
12		following:
13 14		a. A constituent institution of The University of North Carolina as defined in G.S. 116-2(4); or
15		b. A community college as defined in
16		G.S. 115D-2(2): G.S. 115D-2(2); or
17		c. An institution as defined in G.S. 116-22(1).
18		(3) Matriculated status. – Being recognized as a first-time candidate for a
19		degree or certificate, exclusive of any course credits earned while in
20		high school, in a defined program of study at an eligible postsecondary
21		institution.
22		(4) Title IV. – Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended."
23		SECTION 2. G.S. 116-209.26 is amended by adding a new subsection to

"(h) No funds appropriated from the Escheat Fund to the Education Access Rewards North Carolina Scholars Fund shall be used for a grant awarded under this section to a student who is an undergraduate student at an institution as defined in
