12		should seek Homeland Security Grants to augment flyover dollars.

16	SEC	<b>FION 1.(e)</b> The Office of State Budget and Management made the			
17	following recon	nmendations regarding the consolidation of State GIS initiatives:			
18	(1)	Information Technology Projects using GIS should be reviewed by			
19		CGIA to ensure no cross State government agency duplication and to			
20		ensure that the business case has been made for the requested			
21		investment. If multiple projects are solving the same problem, then an			
22		enterprise offering should be considered and built by the CGIA.			
23	(2)	State agencies should evaluate consolidation opportunities to reduce			
24		the number of servers if and where appropriate.			
25		<b>FION 2.</b> Appropriation. – There is appropriated from the General Fund			
26	to the Geograph	hic Information Coordinating Council (GICC) the sum of six hundred			
27	thirty-five thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$635,625) for the 2008-2009 fiscal				
28	year to fund improvements in the State's geographical information system consistent				
29	with the report of the Office of State Budget and Management, dated February 2008,				
30	made in accordance with Section 6.13 of S.L. 2007-323.
