The GICC, the CGIA, the OSBM, and the State agencies would identify both the existing and required recurring funds for framework data layer maintenance to establish the GIS Reserve account. The amounts would be netted out for any anticipated cost share from federal or local governments.

31		plan and follow up with funding for implementation of that plan to

33	(2)	GICC and CGIA should coordinate a statewide flyover for			
34		orthophotography both logistically and via funding across the different			
35		levels of government.			
36	(3)	GICC and CGIA should implement an aggregate cost-share model that			
37		has counties contributing fifty percent (50%), the State contributing			
38		twenty-five percent (25%), and the federal government contributing			
39		twenty-five percent (25%) for a leaf-off product based on the GICC			
40		adopted orthophotography standard.			
41	(4)	Consideration should be given regarding the fifty percent (50%)			
42		county participation to ensure counties with very high growth which

3	(5)	Subject to inclusion in the Governor's Recommended Budget for the		
4		2008-2009 fiscal year, either appropriate the sum of six hundred thirty		
5		five thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$635,625), which		
6		amounts to the twenty-five percent (25%) share, to the GICC for the		
7		State's participation or request the 911 Board to review the language		
8		pertaining to the 911 Fund to consider specifically allocating monies		
9		for the State flyover, or do both.		
10	(6)	GICC via the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety (CCPS)		
11		should seek Homeland Security Grants to augment flyover dollars.		
12	(7)	State agencies, the GICC, and the CGIA should continue to		
13		aggressively seek federal funding grants to fund GIS projects in		
14		addition to orthophotography flyovers.		
15	SECT	TON 1.(e) The Office of State Budget and Management made the		
16	following recom	mendations regarding the consolidation of State GIS initiatives:		
17	(1)	Information Technology Projects using GIS should be reviewed by		
18		CGIA to ensure no cross State government agency duplication and to		
19		ensure that the business case has been made for the requested		
20		investment. If multiple projects are solving the same problem, then an		
21		enterprise offering should be considered and built by the CGIA.		
22	(2)	State agencies should evaluate consolidation opportunities to reduce		
23		the number of servers if and where appropriate.		
24	SECI	TON 2. Appropriation. – There is appropriated from the General Fund		
25	to the Geograph	ic Information Coordinating Council (GICC) the sum of six hundred		
26	thirty-five thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$635,625) for the 2008-2009 fiscal			
27	year to fund improvements in the State's geographical information system consistent			
28	with the report of the Office of State Budget and Management, dated February 2008,			
29	made in accordance with Section 6.13 of S.L. 2007-323.			
30	SECT	TON 3. Effective Date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
