5	SECT	FION 1. Part 1 of Article 1 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is	
6	amended by add	ling the following new section to read:	
7	" <u>§ 130A-16. Race and ethnicity data.</u>		
8	All medical	care providers shall collect and document self-reported race and	
9	ethnicity inform	ation in their registration or intake process of new patients."	
10	SECT	FION 2. G.S. 131E-214.1 reads as rewritten:	
11	"§ 131E-214.1.		
12	As used in the	nis Article:	
13	(1)	"Division" means the Division of Health Service Regulation of the	
14		Department of Health and Human Services.	
15	(2)	"Freestanding ambulatory surgical facility" means a facility licensed	
16		under Part D of Article 6 of this Chapter.	
17	(3)	"Hospital" means a facility licensed under Article 5 of this Chapter or	
18		Article 2 of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes, but does not include	
19		the following:	
20		a. A facility with all of its beds designated for medical type "LTC"	
21		(long-term care).	
22		b. A facility with the majority of its beds designated for medical	
23		type "PSY-3" (mental retardation).	
24		c. A facility operated by the North Carolina Department of	
25		Correction.	
26	(4)	"Patient data" means data that includes a patient's age, sex, race,	
27		ethnicity, zip code, third-party coverage, principal and other diagnosis,

1		date of admission, procedure and discharge date, principal and other	
2		procedures, total charges and components of the total charges,	
3		attending physician identification number, and hospital or freestanding	
4		ambulatory surgical facility identification number.	
5	(5)	"Patient identifying information" means the name, address, social	
6		security number, or similar information by which the identity of a	
7		patient can be determined with reasonable accuracy and speed either	
8		directly or by reference to other publicly available information. The	
9		term does not include a number assigned to a patient by a health care	
10		provider if that number does not consist of or contain numbers,	
11		including social security or drivers license numbers, that could be used	
12		to identify a patient with reasonable accuracy and speed from sources	
13		external to the health care provider.	
14	(6)	"Statewide data processor" means a data processor certified by the	
15		Division as capable of complying with the requirements of	
16		G.S. 131E-214.4. The Division may deny, suspend, or revoke a	
17		certificate, in accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, if	
18		the statewide data processor does not comply with or is not capable of	
19		complying with the requirements of G.S. 131E-214.4. The Division is	
20		authorized to promulgate rules concerning the receipt, consideration,	
21		and limitation of a certificate applied for or issued under this Article."	
22	SECT	FION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the	
23	Department of I	Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of ten	
24	thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year. These funds shall be used to		
25	educate providers on the requirements of this act.		
26	SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2008. The		
27	remainder of this act becomes effective October 1, 2008.
