A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES, IN MAKING CERTIFICATE AND HUMAN OF DETERMINATIONS FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION AND EXPANSION OR RENOVATION OF EXISTING HEALTH CARE FACILITIES, TO TAKE INTO WITH CONSIDERATION CERTAIN FACTORS **RESPECT** TO AVAILABILITY OF SUITABLE HEALTH CARE FACILITIES SERVING COUNTIES WITH RELATIVELY SMALL POPULATIONS; TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED REQUIREMENTS ON THE AVAILABILITY OF LOCAL HOSPITAL SERVICES; AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A DHHS STUDY OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED REVIEW CRITERIA.

Whereas, State law provides "that access to health care services and health care facilities is critical to the welfare of rural North Carolinians, and to the continued viability of rural communities," and that the needs of rural North Carolinians should be considered in the certificate of need review process; and

Whereas, rapid access to emergency medical care is crucial with respect to certain medical conditions such as heart attack and stroke, conditions that could result in death or brain damage if not treated within a few minutes of occurrence; and

Whereas, one of the statutory review criteria for Certificate of Need applications requires the applicant to identify the population to be served and to demonstrate the extent to which all residents of the area and, in particular, low-income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, handicapped persons, the elderly, and other underserved groups are likely to have access to the services; and

Whereas, the health conditions of the overall population being served by health care facilities should be considered when reviewing applications for new or expanded health care facilities; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** When the Department of Health and Human Services reviews applications for certificate of need pertaining to health care facilities and services in rural areas of the State, the Department shall ensure that the availability of existing services and facilities is maintained at levels sufficient to continue to adequately serve the area population, keeping in mind that prompt access to emergency and other health care services and health care facilities is critical to the welfare of rural North Carolinians and to the continued viability of rural communities. Specifically, if a health care facility in a rural community is currently licensed to provide acute care beds and corresponding services but the physical condition of the facility is such that repair, renovation, or new construction is critically needed to serve the facility's population, the Department shall give serious consideration to certificate of need applications designed to continue to provide that population with emergency and other medical services in the most accessible, efficient, and effective manner.

**SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year. These funds shall be used by the Department to have an independent study conducted to review the impact of Certificate of Need review criteria on the availability of hospital services in rural areas of the State.

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
