 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE SPAY/NEUTER ACCOUNT AND
 TO TRANSFER ADMINISTRATION OF THE VOLUNTARY SPAY/NEUTER
 PROGRAM TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND CONSUMER
 SERVICES.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.(a)** The Spay/Neuter Program established under G.S. 19A-61 8 and the Spay/Neuter Account established under G.S. 19A-61 are transferred from the 9 Department of Health and Human Services to the Department of Agriculture and 10 Consumer Services by a Type I transfer as defined by G.S. 143A-6. Any unexpended 11 funds appropriated to the Department of Health and Human Services for the 2008-2009 12 fiscal year to implement the Spay/Neuter Program are transferred to the Department of 13 Agriculture and Consumer Services.

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SECTION 1.(b) G.S. 19A-61 reads as rewritten:

15 "§ 19A-61. Spay/Neuter Program established.

16 There is established in the Department of Health and Human Services Agriculture 17 and Consumer Services a voluntary statewide program to foster the spaying and 18 neutering of dogs and cats for the purpose of reducing the population of unwanted 19 animals in the State. The program shall consist of the following components:

20 (1) Education Program. – The Department shall establish a statewide
21 program to educate the public about the benefits of having cats and
22 dogs spayed and neutered. The Department may work cooperatively
23 on the program with the North Carolina School of Veterinary
24 Medicine, other State agencies and departments, county and city health
25 departments and animal control agencies, and statewide and local

Local Spay/Neuter Assistance Program. – The Department shall administer the Spay/Neuter Account established in G.S. 19A-62. 5	(c) Report. – In February of each year, the Department must report to the Joint
6	Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Fiscal Research Division.
7	The report must contain information regarding all revenues and expenditures of the
8	Spay/Neuter Account."
9	SECTION 1.(d) G.S. 19A-63 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 19A-63. Eligibility for distributions from Spay/Neuter Account.
11	(a) A county or city is eligible for reimbursement from the Spay/Neuter Account
12	if it meets the following condition:
13	(1) The county or city offers one or more of the following programs to
14	low-income persons on a year-round basis for the purpose of reducing
15	the cost of spaying and neutering procedures for dogs and cats:
16	a. A spay/neuter clinic operated by the county or city.
17	b. A spay/neuter clinic operated by a private organization under
18	contract or other arrangement with the county or city.
19	c. A contract or contracts with one or more veterinarians, whether
20	or not located within the county, to provide reduced-cost
21	spaying and neutering procedures.
22	d. Subvention of the spaying and neutering costs incurred by
23	low-income pet owners through the use of vouchers or other
24	procedure that provides a discount of the cost of the spaying or
25	neutering procedure fixed by a participating veterinarian or
26	other provider.
27	e. Subvention of the spaying and neutering costs incurred by
28	persons who adopt a pet from an animal shelter operated by or
29	under contract with the county or city.
30	(2) Reserved for future codification purposes.
31	(b) For purposes of this Article, the term "low-income person" shall mean an
32	individual who qualifies for one or more of the programs of public assistance
33	administered by the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to Chapter
34	108A of the General Statutes. Statutes or whose annual household income is under two
35	hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty level guidelines published by the United
36	States Department of Labor.
37	(c) Each county shall make rules or publish guidelines that designate what proof
38	a low-income person must submit to establish that the person qualifies for public
39	assistance under subsection (b) of this section or has an annual household income lower
40	than two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty level guidelines published by
41	the United States Department of Labor."
42	SECTION 1.(e) Section 19A-64 reads as rewritten:
43	"§ 19A-64. Distributions to counties and cities from Spay/Neuter Account.

43 "§ 19A-64. Distributions to counties and cities from Spay/Neuter Account.

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1 Reimbursable Costs. – Counties and cities eligible for distributions from the (a) 2 Spay/Neuter Account may receive reimbursement for the direct costs of a spay/neuter 3 surgical procedure for a dog or cat owned by a low-income person meeting the 4 Department's eligibility requirements for spay/neuter services. as defined in 5 G.S. 19A-63(b). Reimbursable costs shall include anesthesia, medication, and veterinary 6 services. Counties and cities shall not be reimbursed for the administrative costs of 7 providing reduced-cost spay/neuter services or capital expenditures for facilities and 8 equipment associated with the provision of such services.

9 (b) Application. – A county or city eligible for reimbursement of spaying and 10 neutering costs from the Spay/Neuter Account shall apply to the Department of Health 11 and Human Services Agriculture and Consumer Services by the last day of January, 12 April, July, and October of each year to receive a distribution from the Account for that 13 quarter. The application shall be submitted in the form required by the Department and 14 shall include an itemized listing of the costs for which reimbursement is sought.

15 (c) Distribution. – The Department shall make payments from the Spay/Neuter 16 Account to eligible counties and cities who have made timely application for 17 reimbursement within 30 days of the closing date for receipt of applications for that 18 quarter. In the event that total requests for reimbursement exceed the amounts available 19 in the Spay/Neuter Account for distribution, the monies available will be distributed as 20 follows:

- (1) Fifty percent (50%) of the monies available in the Spay/Neuter
 Account shall be reserved for reimbursement for eligible applicants
 within development tier one areas as defined in G.S. 143B-437.08. The
 remaining fifty percent (50%) of the funds shall be used to fund
 reimbursement requests from eligible applicants in development tier
 two and three areas as defined in G.S. 143B-437.08.
 - (2) Among the eligible counties and cities in development tier one areas, reimbursement shall be made to each eligible county or city in proportion to the number of dogs and cats that have received rabies vaccinations during the preceding fiscal year in that county or city as compared to the number of dogs and cats that have received rabies vaccinations during the preceding fiscal year by all of the eligible applicants in development tier one areas. pursuant to rules adopted by the Department.
 - (3) Among the eligible counties and cities in development tier two and three areas, reimbursement shall be made to each eligible county or city in proportion to the number of dogs and cats that have received rabies vaccinations during the preceding fiscal year in that county or city as compared to the number of dogs and cats that have received rabies vaccinations during the preceding fiscal year by all of the eligible applicants in development tier two and three areas. pursuant to rules adopted by the Department.
- 43 (4) Should funds remain available from the fifty percent (50%) of the
 44 Spay/Neuter Account designated for development tier one areas after

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1 reimbursement of all claims by eligible applicants in those areas, the 2 remaining funds shall be made available to reimburse eligible 3 applicants in development tier two and three areas." 4 **SECTION 1.(f)** Section 19A-65 reads as rewritten: 5 "§ 19A-65. Annual Report Required From Every Animal Shelter in Receipt of 6 State or Local Funding. 7 Every county or city animal shelter, or animal shelter operated under contract with a 8 county or city or otherwise in receipt of State or local funding shall prepare an annual 9 report setting forth the numbers, by species, of animals received into the shelter, the 10 number adopted out, the number returned to owner, and the number destroyed. The 11 report shall also contain the total operating expenses of the shelter and the cost per 12 animal handled. The report shall be filed with the Department of Health and Human 13 Services Agriculture and Consumer Services by August 1 March 1 of each year. A city 14 or county that does not timely file the report required by this section is not eligible to 15 receive reimbursement payments under G.S. 19A-64 during the calendar year in which 16 the report was to be filed. 17 SECTION 2.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 18 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services the sum of two million dollars 19 (\$2,000,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year for the purpose of funding the Spay/Neuter 20 fund established under G.S. 19A-62(a). These funds are in addition to the funds 21 available from the Spay/Neuter Account under G.S. 19A-62(b) and any funds 22 transferred in Section 1 of this act. Funds appropriated in this section shall not revert but 23 may be used by the Department during the 2009-2011 biennium. It is the intention of 24 the General Assembly to appropriate for the 2009-2011 biennium for the purpose of 25 funding the Spay/Neuter Account the sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 26 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 27 2010-2011 fiscal year. 28 **SECTION 2.(b)** Prior to January 1, 2009, the Department shall notify 29 counties and cities that have, prior to that notification deadline, established eligibility 30 for distribution of funds from the Spay/Neuter Account pursuant to G.S. 19A-63, of the 31 following: 32 (1)The amount of funding in the Spay and Neuter Account the 33 Department that will have available for distribution to each county or 34 city receiving notification to pay reimbursement requests submitted by 35 the county or city during the calendar year following the notification 36 deadline; and 37 The amount of additional funding, if any, the Department estimates, (2)38 but does not guarantee, may be available to pay reimbursement 39 requests submitted by the notified county or city to the Department 40 during the calendar year following the notification deadline. 41 SECTION 3. G.S. 106-284.40 is amended by adding a new subsection to 42 read: 43 "(d) To the extent not applied to cover the costs of inspection of canned pet food 44 and commercial feeds, fees and other receipts collected under this section shall be

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1	applied to implement the Local Spay/Neuter Assistance Program created by
2	<u>G.S. 19A-61(2).</u> "
3	SECTION 4. G.S. 130A-190(b) reads as rewritten:
4	"(b) Fee. – Rabies vaccination tags, links, and rivets may be obtained from the
5	Department. Department of Health and Human Services. The Secretary is authorized to
6	establish by rule a fee for the rabies tags, links, and rivets in accordance with this
7	subsection. The fee for each tag is the sum of the following:
8	(1) The actual cost of the rabies tag, links, and rivets.
9	(2) Transportation costs.
10	(3) Five cents (5ϕ) . This portion of the fee shall be used to fund rabies
11	education and prevention programs.
12	(4) Twenty cents (20¢). This portion of the fee shall be credited to the
13	Spay/Neuter Account established in G.S. 19A-62 and used to fund
14	statewide spay/neuter programs. This portion of the fee shall not be
15	imposed for tags provided to persons who operate establishments
16	primarily for the purpose of boarding or training hunting dogs or who
17	own and vaccinate 10 or more dogs per year."
18	SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
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
