As used in this sub-sub-subdivision, "passenger motor vehicle" has the same meaning as "private passenger vehicle" as defined in G.S. 20-4.01. Every new passenger motor vehicle that is transferred to or purchased by the Department shall have a fuel economy for the new vehicle's model year that is in the top fifteen percent (15%) of its class of comparable automobiles. The required fuel economy under this sub-sub-subdivision does not apply to vehicles used in law enforcement, emergency medical response, and firefighting. The Department shall report the number of new passenger motor vehicles that are purchased or transferred as required by this sub-sub-subdivision, the savings or costs for the transfer or purchase of vehicles to comply with this sub-sub-subdivision, and the quantity and cost of fuel saved for the previous fiscal year on or before 1 October of each year to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Environmental Review Commission.

As used in this section, "passenger motor vehicle" has the same meaning as "private passenger vehicle" as defined in G.S. 20-4.01.
- (b) Every new passenger motor vehicle that is transferred to or purchased by the Department of Transportation shall have a fuel economy for the new vehicle's model year that is in the top fifteen percent (15%) of its class of comparable automobiles.
